

Beacon Class

It has been lovely to welcome Beacon class back after half term. The children have come back brilliantly and with fantastic learning attitudes.

We have got stuck straight in with our new English topic on a book called Floodland, looking at addition and subtraction in Maths, begun our topic on the Romans and began our investigative science unit on materials and their properties.



It was also super lovely to share some reading time with Triscombe class this week and use our fabulous school library together.

Alfoxton Class



We have had a lovely start to the second half of the autumn term and the colder air and darker days make us feel cosy in our toasty, warm classroom.

We have begun learning about the rivers in the local area and across the United Kingdom which links to our English perfectly as we read books about water and rivers!

We began our English work by looking at a picture book called, 'Once Upon a Raindrop'. Inspired by this book, we thought about all the different sounds that water makes and collected them to write poems with stanzas showing three different tenses. Take a look at one of our wonderful water poems!

Our art is also linked to the theme of rivers and water as we study two collage artists - Ed Fairburn and Robin Brooks. We discovered that Ed Fairburn is inspired by maps depicting rivers and portraits, whilst Robin Brooks is inspired by nature, especially scenes depicting the coast. This term we will produce our own collages in the style of Ed Fairburn and Robin Brooks using maps, tissue paper, pens and pencils.

Triscombe Class

It's been another busy, fun-filled week in Triscombe. In Adventurers, we made blueberry muffins that were as delicious as we expected. We took turns weighing and mixing the ingredients. We were careful not to lick the spoon!

In English, we have been busy writing instructions on how to sow a seed. We would like to use these to help the rest of school grow plants that we hope will go into our quirky garden.

We have also been busy making Autumn art.







We made Autumn trees using broccoli and made apple print pumpkins.

We have lots of exciting learning planned in the run-up to Christmas, including preparing for the Christmas Nativity production.



Preschool

We have been learning about Bonfire night and been exploring different ways to make 'Fireworks'. We used cut toilet rolls, dunked in paint to make colourful fireworks and used different shapes and material to create fireworks. Our favourite activity however was dropping paint into gloop and using paint-brushes to create swirls and patterns in the gloop. (It was even more fun, when we used our fingers and got really messy!)

We also had great fun twirling sparklers and watching the sparks fly as we made circles in the air!

Mum's Mincemeat Recipe - makes about 2.5kg

1 lb raisins 1 tsp cloves

12 oz currants900g apples (peeled & diced)8 oz sultanas2 lemons (zest & juice)8 oz soft brown sugar4 tbsp golden syrup6 oz butter4 tbsp brandy or rum2 tsp cinnamon85g roasted hazelnuts

2 tsp nutmeg 140ml cider

Put cider into a big pan. Add the butter, syrup and sugar and heat gently until butter is melted. Add all the dried fruits, apple, spices, lemon zest and juice. Stir well.

Bring to simmering point, and simmer covered for 40 minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove lid, and simmer for another 15 minutes, or until the liquid is almost absorbed.

Remove from the heat, cool slightly, stir in the brandy/rum and nuts.

Put into sterilised jars and seal.

Making progress on the Service Center

Located between the two nuclear reactors, Hinkley Point C's Operational Service Centre will be home to hundreds of Hinkley Point C staff when the power station becomes operational.

It will include general office space, welfare facilities and workshops and be a central shared hub for both units.

Over the coming months, a team from Alumet UK will be installing what's known as the "envelope" - the windows, curtain walling, waterproof cladding and security features that give any building its distinct identity.



Overall around 2,500m2 of curtain wall and composite panels will be installed, as well as 4,500m of fire barriers, all essential components to one of the power stations most important buildings.

Sixteen intrepid graduates from Hinkley Point C completed a 16-mile walk along the Jurassic Coast in Dorset. It took them nine hours but the effort was well worth it. They raised more than £2,500 for homeless charity, Social Bite


