Stogursey Flower Show


This year's Flower Show will be on **Saturday 2 August.**

Points from the Parish Council Meeting 14th January 2025

Somerset County

We were advised that Somerset Council, as part of the process in establishing a new local plan for the county, and being expected to provide around 57,000 new homes, was looking for potential sites to be identified. Concerns were also raised over the time it was taking for planning applications to be processed.

Speed Indicator Devices (SIDs)

Many people will have noticed the sudden appearance over the Christmas period of 5 new metal posts at various points along the roadside. These are for the two SIDs the Council has just agreed to purchase. The intention is for the devices to be moved between the various sites around the parish to encourage drivers not to speed.

Grant

We reviewed the amount of grant to be awarded to Citizens Advice West Somerset and felt that it was appropriate to award them £500 towards the invaluable work that they do in providing support for local residents.

Meetings

We were advised that that Rachel Gilmour, the local MP, would be holding a surgery in Stogursey on the 7th February.

Enhancements

It was felt that the Christmas tree put up in the village looked very good. It was agreed that regular cleaning of the windows of our Burton and Stogursey bus shelters should be untaken. It was also agreed to set monies aside to help the volunteers with the filling the planters on The Gravel and elsewhere around the parish.

Burgage Road Play Area

Following the annual inspection of the playground, it had been necessary to temporarily remove the swinging basket on one play item as well as remove a bench that had rotted away. A working group will be set up to visit and look at what remedial work was required.

Date of next Meeting

The Parish Council is due to meet on the evening of **Tuesday 18**th **February**, the meeting will commence at 19:00 in the Victory Hall. All are welcome to attend.

As we embark on the term ahead, let's continue to foster this positivity and dedication, working together to ensure every child thrives. Here's to a successful and rewarding start to 2025!



Major Milestone: Generator Stator Installed



Just before Christmas, a major milestone was achieved with the installation of the generator stator in the Unit 1 Turbine Hall.

At 12 metres long and weighing over 450 tonnes, the stator is one of the heaviest and most significant pieces of equipment installed at Hinkley Point C so far.

Did you know?

The stator is a key part of the electricity generator. It works alongside the world's most powerful steam turbine to produce electricity.

When Hinkley Point C is operational, its two turbine generators will provide 3.2GW of low-carbon electricity - that's enough to power six million homes and meet 7% of the UK's energy needs!

Inspiring the next generation



Hinkley Point C is engaging with local schools to spark interest in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) from an early age.

In 2024 the HPC Visits Team hosted more than 80 visits from schools, colleges and universities to the Hinkley Point C site, showing more than 2,000 pupils and their teachers the incredible work being done.
