Reading is at the very heart of everything we do at school, and I have had the pleasure of hearing children read across different year groups. It was a real joy to listen to their growing confidence, fluency, and enthusiasm as they tackled new words and explored exciting stories. Whether reading aloud in class, delving into books during independent time, or sharing stories with friends, it's clear that a love of reading is thriving within our school.

It has also been fantastic to see reading embedded across lessons, with children using texts to spark curiosity, support their learning, and develop their comprehension skills. Our well-stocked library continues to be a wonderful space for children to discover new books, and it's been lovely to see them making the most of it—choosing stories that interest them, revisiting favourites, and exploring new genres.

Encouraging a lifelong love of reading is one of the most valuable gifts we can give our children. Whether at school or home, every moment spent with a book is an opportunity to expand their world, develop their imagination, and build essential skills for the future.

Beacon

Beacon class have been extending their learning on our book, 'The Dam', and have continued to build multi-clausal sentences with expanded noun-phrases, fronted adverbials and also using semi-colons!



They have also had fun applying these skills to some creative writing of their own. The Year 5s are continuing to work really hard on their Maths with Mr Tucker, and the Year 6s have been working so hard on embedding their knowledge of division by a 2-digit number, although it is very tricky. They are using their resilience and digging deep.

Alfoxton

This week we have been learning even more about Vikings in History; using inverted commas for speech in our English work; testing different coloured overlays on our periscopes in Science; creating awesome moves in Dance, and, becoming masters of addition and subtraction in Maths - gosh, we have been busy!

In RE we have been thinking about the miracles Jesus performed (as written in the Bible). It made us think about how many people have experienced miracles, whether we have experienced any, and whether people really believe that all the miracles were recorded accurately. We have learned in our History studies that the Anglo-Saxon Chronicles said that Vikings raided with fire-breathing dragons flying overhead! We wondered about the accuracy of historical stories and how additions might have come about over time. After considering our own beliefs, we reflected on the morals of well-known stories and what we can learn from them. We discovered that many of Jesus' miracles teach us about kindness and having faith in ourselves and one another. It was quite interesting!

Triscombe

In Science, our young learners dove into the fascinating world of insects, discovering key facts about these tiny creatures. This topic was further explored during busy learning, where the children eagerly investigated the characteristics and behaviours of different insects.





In Art, they used their knowledge of primary colours and colour mixing to create vibrant prints of flowers and fruit, showcasing their artistic flair. A particular highlight of the week has been the children's enthusiasm for the trajectory maths area, where they've been engaging in hands-on activities to explore movement and angles. It's been a wonderful, action-packed week of learning for everyone!

PreschoolWe have been exploring!







The children absolutely loved going on a welly-walk around the village and got very muddy jumping in puddles.

We have made biscuits and also learned more about Winter. We have done some shadow matching which the children were absolutely amazing at!

We have also celebrated the beginning of the Chinese New Year, which this year, is the year of the snake.

The children have watched a short video clip explaining about Chinese New Year, made collage lanterns and used their scissor skills to cut a spiral snake. At snack time they tried some Chinese food and enjoyed a fortune cookie. We also looked to see what each of the children's names would look like, written in Chinese symbols and what the meaning of their names were.

At the end of the day, they took home their own lucky red wallet containing a chocolate coin!



Apprenticeships

The number of apprentices trained has passed a new milestone of 1,500 - 500 more than the original target - with more to come. 70% of them are from the South-West.

Hinkley Point C has established three training "Centres of Excellence" in Bridgwater and Cannington to help local people join the project. More than 8,000 people have already been trained in welding, electrical, and mechanical skills. The National College for Nuclear in Cannington is training a new workforce for Britain's nuclear industry.

Many of the new apprentices started their careers as part of the project's Somerset-based Young HPC programme. Jobs and careers support is provided by the Hinkley Point C Jobs Service based in Bridgwater.

Young HPC



This half term, Young HPC members have been offered another chance to learn more about the Hinkley Point C project and how nuclear works with a tour of the site, and time to check out the interactive experiments at the Visitors Centre.

All attendees had the chance to earn their 'HPC, Nuclear & Low Carbon Pro' Digital Badge to impress prospective employers!

Hinkley Point C Community Fund

£2,500 was awarded in December 2024 to the Stogursey Community Network to contribute towards their community lunch group for older people in the village.

Stogursey Community Network is made up of 20 local volunteers who run a weekly community lunch club for a mostly older population in Stogursey. They also provide transport for medical appointments. They are essentially a community help group that sprung up as a result of Covid in the community. They work with the village agents, dementia support café and the West Somerset Food Bank in order to support residents.


The grant has helped cover the costs of transport costs, venue hire, food costs as well as a contribution towards the group's insurance in order to keep running the lunch club.





March 2025

First cold leg



The team in the Reactor Building of Unit 1 introduced the first cold leg of our Primary Circuit.

This is the circuit of pipework that'll take water from the Steam Generator back to the Reactor Pressure Vessel, so it can be reheated and used to regulate the temperature of the Reactor.

With the introduction of the first leg complete, teams are one step closer to starting the Primary Circuit welding.

Final Steam Generator



The final Steam Generator for Unit 1 arrived at Hinkley Point C where it will be stored ahead of installation into the Reactor Building later this year.

In total, four steam generators will be placed in each reactor building, operating at an average temperature of 295°C for at least 60 years.

Weighing 520 tonnes, each Steam Generator contains almost 6,000 tubes which allow heat to pass safely from the reactor to the turbine, ensuring the water / steam in each system remains separate.

3,000 new jobs in Somerset

Over the next 18 months, Hinkley Point C will create 3,000 new jobs in Somerset as it approaches peak construction, with around 15,000 people expected to be building the power station.

The increase will provide a major jobs boost for Somerset with 3,000 new roles set to be created. The new roles will be in a vast range of different professions and we remain on target to meet the strong commitments we have made on local recruitment. We will continue to focus on recruiting locally with people from across Somerset supported through training in our new training centres of excellence and a dedicated Jobs Service.

As the workforce expands, we will continue to work closely with local authorities and community groups to minimise disruption and prioritise the benefits for our County.


