Thoughts following Stogursey Flower Show

First, let's be clear, Stogursey Flower Show isn't Chelsea or even Taunton Flower Show, but it's all the better for that. It's a Village Show, open to all of us to enter and have our work displayed, as long as we follow the limited number of rules.

It seems to me that there are broadly two kinds of entrant. First, there are the Expert Growers and Makers, exhibiting year after year to a very high standard. Their skills and creativity inspire admiration in the rest of us. The Experts vie for the coveted red cards (1st Place) and the chance to win a Cup or two for the display shelf.

The Show is, as mentioned above, open to all-comers and here I come to the Also Rans. Some us may quickly join the Experts and we can all dream of being awarded First Place. We might be pleasantly surprised and manage the occasional red, blue (2nd) or yellow (3rd) card. Our marmalade will be promoted or demoted from one year to the next, depending on the quality of the other entries. The judges are kinder than they used to be and avoid writing comments such as 'a Victoria Sponge should be presented on a doily.' Indeed, they appear to avoid any comments, perhaps a nod to the inclusivity of our age. As an Also Ran, who sometimes gets placed, I won't deny a bit of a competitive streak. I recall having beginner's luck the first time I entered. I was delighted when my collection of 5 herbs came in 3rd. But I came back down to earth when I realised later that I had entered 6 herbs, so should have been disqualified.

All those who enter the Flower Show have in common their enthusiasm for keeping this village tradition alive, giving enjoyment to the considerable number of visitors to what is, in essence, a local exhibition with prizes.

It would be heartening to see a rise in the number of entrants. Coming 2nd out of only 2 entries is a bit disappointing and more entries would mean there is even more for visitors to enjoy. So, if you are new to Stogursey or new to entering the Flower Show, even if you have just one potted plant which gives you pleasure, don't be a shrinking violet and do join in next year!

To all the stewards who covered the exhibitions across the week, you did a brilliant job and we hope you will join us again next year. With out you we could not have opened the exhibition for so many of the days. Thanks to the Fairfield Trust for providing funded grant aid, to our sponsors, fundraisers and for all the donations gratefully received.

Finally thanks again to all the flower arrangers, performers, musicians, artists, designers, projectionists, photographers, sculptors, artisans, and to you the audience for taking part and attending; we hope you will continue to support the Festival as we go forward into 2025.



Apples Galore!

2024 seems to be one of those years with an abundance of apples. 1982 was another such applerich year, so much so that the Glastonbury WI collected a number of recipes, and printed them in a booklet simply called, 'Apple Recipes'.

Here is one of the recipes from the booklet.

Malvern Pudding

Ingredients:

Base - 1 lb cooking apples; 1 oz butter; 1 oz sugar; granted rind of 1 lemon.

Sauce - 1 egg; 1 oz butter; 1 oz plain flour; 1 oz sugar; $\frac{3}{4}$ pint milk.

Topping - 2 oz demerara sugar; ½ teaspoon cinnamon; ½ oz butter.

Method:

Base - Peel, core and slice apples. Place butter in a saucepan and melt. Add apples and sugar. Cover and cook over low heat stirring occasionally until soft and thick. Remove from heat and stir in lemon rind. Spread in 1½ pint ovenproof dish.

Sauce - Melt butter, stir in flour and cook gently. Add milk and bring to boil, stirring, and simmer for 2 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in sugar. Gradually stir in beaten egg. Return to heat and cook for 1 minute stirring. Pour sauce over apple.

Topping - Prepare medium grill. Mix brown sugar and cinnamon together. Sprinkle on top of sauce and dot with butter. Place dish under grill and heat until sugar has caramalised. Serve hot or cold.

Bridge of smiles on Rwanda trip

'A "life-changing experience" was how Cat Jones described her recent volunteering adventure building a bridge for a remarkable charity.

The Balfour Beatty Supervisor was one of a team of Balfour Beatty and Mott MacDonald volunteers who travelled to rural Rwanda in partnership with Bridges to Prosperity.

Cat adopted similar procedures used at Hinkley Pont C to construct a 58m trail bridge (pictured right) in the rural community of Rebero.

The team raised an incredible £30,000 to fund things like tools and PPE. Cat said: "The highlights were engaging with the local community of more than 4,000 people, building the bridge and visiting a primary school to donate school supplies and games to the children.

"It was incredible to use our construction skills and see first-hand the positive impact the bridge will have on the community."



Flamanville 3 switched on



Flamanville 3 - Hinkley Point C's sister station located in France - has been switched on.

Teams started a controlled nuclear reaction for the first time - known as "first criticality". This is an important milestone in the start-up of a nuclear power station. Power will be gradually ramped up over the coming months.

Later in the year, the the station will be connected to the national grid for the first time, and will then generate electricity. Over 1,500 safety criteria need to be met during the startup.

Upcoming Roadworks - C182

Somerset Council will be carrying out resurfacing work on the C182 with preliminary work beginning soon. You may see temporary traffic management and traffic lights on the road. The full schedule and plan for the main phase of road works will be provided by Somerset Council which will likely involve overnight weeknight road closures. Throughout all the phases of the works emergency vehicle access will be maintained.

Project Update

A round up of the latest news from Hinkley Point C October 2024



Alternative Saltmarsh Locations considered by Hinkley Point C

Hinkley Point C is now investigating new locations for the creation of saltmarsh, as an alternative to the proposed site at Pawlett Hams near Bridgwater in Somerset. This follows a public consultation held earlier this year where hundreds of people shared their views on the proposal.

Hinkley Point C is obliged to make environmental improvements like saltmarsh to compensate for the very small impact the power station will have on fish numbers when operational. Measures also include the improvement of weirs in tributary rivers to help migrating fish reach their breeding grounds.



Creating saltmarsh is a proven way to increase and protect biodiversity. It will help fish by providing breeding grounds and provide food and shelter for birds and animals. Saltmarsh also filters and cleans water, prevents floods and locks away carbon in one of our most effective weapons in the fight against climate change.

Reactor Pressure Vessel Installation



In the autumn, the Reactor Pressure Vessel - the heart of the power station - will be installed into the Unit 1 Reactor Building. Five paths must be completed before the installation of the Reactor Pressure Vessel.

The first big step was achieved last month when the teams lifted a "heavy floor" into position. This finished off the adjacent Fuel Building up to the + 19.m level.

The next step is to get the Polar Crane ready for use. This is the large gantry crane that'll swivel round the circumference of the Reactor Building and manoeuvre heavy components into place during construction, maintenance work and refuelling.
