(Please Note: This is only for those patients who are unable to collect from the Surgery or the SPAR/PO.)

#### **MEDICAL TRANSPORT**

For residents in the Stogursey parish, our DBS-checked volunteer drivers can take you to a **medical appointment**, including doctor, dentist, optician, physiotherapy etc, if you are unable to get there any other way. Payment is by cash donation of your choice, cheques also accepted.

Please note that we are all volunteers and sometimes we may not be able to fulfil your request, although we always do our very best. We do require **48 hrs notice** for all requests please.

# Points from the Parish Council Meeting 13th August 2024

#### Vacancy for Parish Clerk

The Parish Clerk is retiring and has given his notice to the Parish Council at its July meeting. An advert has been placed within this issue of Stogursey News, on the noticeboards across the parish, and on the parish website. If the role appeals, why not ask for an application pack which gives full details of the role and an application form to apply which needs to be submitted by 6<sup>th</sup> September. It is planned that interviews will be held in mid-September, with hopefully a 1<sup>st</sup> October start date.

#### **Hinkley Point Main Site Forum**

The next meeting is to be held at the Victory Hall on 17<sup>th</sup> October at 18:00, and all parishioners are welcome to attend. The forum receives updates and gives the attendees the opportunity to raise questions directly to the representatives present.

#### **Parish Defibrillators**

The latest addition to the defibrillators at Stolford, Shurton and Stogursey is a unit now available, 24 hours a day, on the garden wall at Burton Farmhouse. Thanks must go to the Somerset Community Foundation and HPC Community grant for funding the unit. Sarens UK have kindly agreed to hosting the unit for which the Parish Council is very grateful.

The Parish Council is seeking assistance from local residents living near to the defibrillators to ensure that they are in-situ and operational, on a weekly basis. Anyone who feels they could spare 5 minutes a week carrying out such checks, could you please contact the Clerk.

#### Do you keep birds outside?

The Government are bringing in the requirement for the keeper of up to 49 poultry or other kept birds to register with the <a href="https://www.gov.uk/guidance/register-as-a-keeper-of-less-than-50-poultry-or-other-captive-birds">www.gov.uk/guidance/register-as-a-keeper-of-less-than-50-poultry-or-other-captive-birds</a> by 1st October 2024.

You do not need to register psittaciformes or passeriformes (such as budgies, parrots, cockatiels and finches) if they are both: fully housed in a dwelling (your home or another indoor structure) and, kept indoors at all times with no access to outdoor spaces

The Parish Council is due to meet on the evening of **Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> September.** The meeting will commence at 19:00, in the Victory Hall. All are welcome to attend.

We are looking for a new parish clerk with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> October 2024. This is a very varied and interesting role; duties will include:

- Preparation for and attending monthly parish council (agendas, papers and production of minutes) and other ad hoc meetings.
   Meetings are mostly evenings but some may be held during the day.
- Dealing with all correspondence, updating notice boards and the Stogursey Parish website
- Advising the Council on legal and financial matters ensuring the Council is acting within its legal powers and responsibilities
- Acting as Responsible Financial Officer in keeping the Council's financial records and completing the audit process each year (including processing of invoices, PAYE, bank reconciliation and annual accounts)
- Undertaking such other admin duties as the Council may require from time to time

The post holder will be required to work from home; office equipment (laptop computer and printer) will be provided. The time spent by the Clerk on Council business varies throughout the year, but approximates to fourteen hours per week.



#### **News from the Quantock Medical Centre**

We were all very pleased to hear that we had come 1st in Somerset in the National Patient Survey again this year, all thanks to the great team of staff we have working here and thanks to those patients who took the time to complete the survey.

This autumn brings a new vaccine to combat Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) which is an infectious disease of the airways and lungs. Its symptoms are similar to a cold, including cough, sore throat, sneezing and runny or blocked nose. It can make you become wheezy or short of breath and lead to pneumonia or other life-threatening conditions. Every year thousands of older adults need hospital care for the RSV, and some will die. RSV can become more severe in people with medical conditions such as heart and lung disease or a weakened immune system.

The RSV vaccine can be given at the same time as a Shingles vaccine, but it is not advised to be given on the same day as a Flu or Covid vaccination, and evidence suggests that protection last for 2 years. RSV vaccine will be available for people over 75 years of age (after 1st of September 2024) and anyone already 75 to 79 years old on 1st September 2024. Some 80 year olds will also be eligible. Also, all pregnant women from 28 weeks gestation will be invited.

If you are eligible, you will be contacted by the practice to book an appointment.

As well as the new RSV campaign, we will be busy running our annual Flu Clinics at the practice:

### From 1st September

- Pregnant women,
- Children aged 2-3 years (on 31st August 2024)
- Children aged 6 months to under 18 years in a clinical risk group (Diseases of the Heart, Lung, Kidney, Liver, Blood, Asthma, COPD, Diabetes, Kidney, weakened immune system, Stroke, with a BMI of 40 or higher.)

#### From 3rd October

- Aged 65 years and over
- Aged 18 years to under 65 years in Clinical risk group (Diseases of the Heart, Lung, Kidney, Liver, Blood, Asthma, COPD, Diabetes, Kidney, weakened immune system, Stroke, with a BMI of 40 or higher)
- Care home residents
- Carers
- Immunocompromised patients and close contacts
- Front line social care staff

Please look out for dates or contact the Practice to book an appointment.

As always, we ask that you support your local practice by having your vaccination with us rather than using a Pharmacy; as we have to order our flu vaccine supplies a year in advance and it will be a terrible waste of money to throw these away at the end of the year if not used!

These structures are then delivered and lifted into position in one go, rather than asking our team members to assemble them piece by piece in situ. It's proving to be of huge benefit, improving quality and increasing productivity.

This method also means we can reduce the amount of manual handling and installation work for our workforce. This results in a safer, healthier and more efficient working environment for everyone
