

The keys to the (new) Victory Hall

were handed over to Chris Ford on Friday 9th October.

A tour of the building the following morning revealed what a tremendous asset this is going to be for Stogursey Parish. The Trustees can rightly feel very proud of what has been achieved.

Praise was given, by both Chris Ford and Allan Searle, to Brian Neale the Site Manager who has been on site throughout the build. The building was designed by LED Architects of Highbridge and built by Harris Bros and Collard of Bridgwater.



The automatic opening doors feature this image - the Borough Seal of Stogursey.

The seal dates back to about 1225 when Stogursey was recorded as a borough. The legend on the seal reads: "SIGILL' COMMUNE BURGENSIUN DE STOKES CURCI", which translates as: "the Common Seal of the Burgesses of Stokes Courcy".



Once through the doors, the building feels very welcoming and spacious.

Behind a serving hatch into the hall is an impressive room with a stainless steel dishwasher, cold storage cabinets, ice-maker . . . no this isn't the kitchen, it's the bar, with its own adjacent store for the beer.

The kitchen is stainless steel throughout: a 6-ring hob with huge double-door oven beneath, a separate 'combipro' oven, double sink, commercial dishwasher, huge fridge, freezer, big warming cabinet beneath the serving

hatch opening into the main hall. A professional kitchen indeed, which isn't surprising as it was designed by Aspen in consultation with Denise Oliver who drew on her experience of Cannington Primary School where she is head cook, serving up to 160 meals a day.



With its own serving hatch into the kitchen, is the Lord St Audries room, where the original Victory Hall plaque, looking a little weather-worn, has been mounted. With its own hearing loop and TV screen, this is the room for meetings.

The football teams are going to be well impressed with the "muddy entrance" from the field into the two changing rooms; each with its own showers, toilets and ample changing space. There is also a separate 'officials' changing room.

And hopefully, for future stage productions - QMTC, school concert, Stogursey Pantomime - the changing facilities will be appreciated by the performers. The 'green room' is a very useful space behind the stage, and as well as steps, has a lift giving access to the stage.

Finally, the hall itself. A lovely space with great acoustics: it was possible to hear someone speaking in an ordinary voice from the opposite end of the hall. There is an inbuilt hearing loop, and no clutter of radiators as all heating is under-floor. At the stage end is a 4-metre screen with laser projector.

HIRING THE HALL

Although it is hoped that the hall will be available for bookings by late-November, Covid-19 restrictions will limit many potential bookings. The pupils at the school are going to benefit, as they will be using the hall for their PE lessons.

OPEN VIEWING WEEKENDS

The Trustees are planning to have two open weekends when parishioners can visit and see the new hall for themselves. Look out for the dates!





Slight change of Name

We have removed the word 'Support' from our group's name, but not because we are not still offering as much support as ever! We just want to be clear that the **Stogursey Community Network** is for the long-term, not just during the Covid pandemic. So, we are now known as Stogursey Community Network (SCN) and, as such, we include various voluntary community schemes, including a very welcome new initiative (see below).

Share-a-Meal and Community Lunch Club plans

As current Covid restrictions do not allow us to start the Community Lunch Club yet, we plan soon to centralise our current **Stogursey Share-a-Meal** home delivery scheme, with the help of our volunteer cooks and using the funds granted by Somerset Community Foundation. We are very keen to ensure that the Share-a-Meal scheme reaches everyone who could benefit from the service. If you, or anyone you know, could benefit from a delicious home-cooked meal delivered weekly to the door in hygienic re-heatable containers, please do get in touch (see contact information below), even if just to chat about the scheme.

We are still looking for volunteer cooks or general helpers for the Lunch Club (eventually), so if you are interested in helping, please do get in touch.

Foodbank Parcels

Although deliveries from the Quantock Foodbank have ceased for the time being (apart from a family package for Half Term), we are still collecting donations for the Foodbank which volunteers take along regularly. Please keep the donations coming! In Rev'd Nicky's garage please, or try next door (Coach House) if it's locked. Thank you.

If you need to make a referral for Foodbank support for yourself or others, do contact us.

Delivery of Medical Prescriptions

Deliveries of patients' prescriptions to the village Post Office continue. Although most patients are able to collect from there, any patients who cannot get to their Medical Centre or the Post Office to collect their own medications (this is determined by the Surgery) may request, via the Surgery, that the medication is delivered to their homes by the volunteers.

NEW! Voluntary Driving Scheme: Transport for Medical Appointments Only

In response to several requests, a group of volunteers is going to trial a temporary voluntary drivers scheme for local medical appointments <u>only</u> - that is Cannington and Quantock Health Centres, and dental, physiotherapy etc in Bridgwater. This would be for single passengers, same-household couples or parent and child, sitting in the back, wearing face masks (unless exempt). However, we have only a few drivers at the moment and cannot guarantee availability. The number to ring to book transport is <u>07485 350560</u>.

The service will be free to the users, no money will change hands. However, if any users would like to make a donation to the SCN (which is going to cover the mileage costs for the drivers), there will be Donation Tins available soon in the Village Shops. We'd be grateful for your support, just give what you can afford. Anyone else willing to help out by driving, please contact the Coordinators on the mobile number above.

Please note that you may be entitled to NHS free hospital transport. You can find out by phoning the NHS Patient Transport Advice Centre 01278 727444 between 8.30 am and 6.30 pm, Monday - Friday.

Stogursey C of E Primary and Pre-School



WELLBEING Since returning to school, each class has had a weekly wellbeing lesson to begin to provide children with an understanding of what wellbeing is. We have had lots of discussions with the children about the importance of taking care of our minds as well as our bodies. We have focused on the vocabulary we might use to begin to give children the language to talk about their own physical and mental wellbeing. The children have explored different feelings that they might experience in certain situations and we have focused a lot on strategies to help with these feelings. We have spent lots of time outdoors and the children are beginning to think of things that they can do themselves if they experience a particular feeling. The topic of wellbeing is an ongoing one and each class will continually revisit it so that children understand that taking care of their physical and mental health is vital.

This is what the children have had to say about our wellbeing topic:

"You have to take care of your mind and your body. If your mind doesn't feel good then you can drink lots of water". *Aaliyah*, Y2

"If you're feeling sick then you should talk to people and they can help you. Wellbeing means being healthy and you can eat fruit to keep your mind and body healthy". Casey C, Y3

"I eat bananas and fruit to make me healthy and strong". Ava, Reception

"Wellbeing means that you are well and good. If I'm feeling sad then I get my favourite toy to help me feel better". *Harry, Y1*

Triscombe Class by Alfie and Alexzander

"I like my classroom. We have dinosaurs - only toy ones! I like phonics - when you learn new letters. It's my favourite lesson because I like spelling new words. I love everything about school, all the playing, all the learning." Alfie

"We have lego in our class, I like playing with lego. I like learning numbers - all the numbers. [My favourite number is] one hundred and fifty-five. [You write it] 1-5-5. We were playing with instruments. I like the triangle and the tambourine." *Alexzander*

Art

"In Art we're painting a mask which is going to be going around the Bridgwater shops. The mask will be like playing a hide-go-seek game. It could be anywhere, you have to find which shop it's in. It's very big, and we're painting it." *Tobie*

"Other schools are doing it too." Jacob

"I enjoy art. I enjoyed making and painting little models. We made them of clay." *Ameleah*

Science

Beacon class have thoroughly enjoyed learning about different plant species and their characteristics. The children have discovered the wonderful world of non-vascular plants through the process of growing moss on tree roots. The moss was very carefully examined and scientifically labelled with the properties of non-vascular plants so that any new scientists can learn from their discoveries.



The children conducted a similar activity exploring insectivorous plants such as the Venus Fly Trap, Sundew and Pitcher plant. The children enjoyed making comparisons between these plants and those which were discovered on a walk of the school grounds.

THE CATCH-UP During the first few weeks, we got to know more about the children and their needs following the national lockdown. We have noticed that children have largely forgotten their times tables. We have also noticed that the amount of writing children produce has diminished. This is probably because they didn't have to write as much during the lockdown as they do in school.

Pupils from Years 4, 5 and 6 talked about catch-up:

Maths

"We do times tables in the morning and after lunch, and we get 2 minutes to complete 40 questions. For the first time yesterday I got 40. The 7x table." *Mason*

"You can get up to 40, but some people don't get that far. Today I got to 32. The first time I tried I got 1, but today I got 32. I'm doing the 3x table." *Tobie*

"We've started rounding to the nearest 100, then to the nearest 1000 and then 10,000 and then 100,000, and now we're up to millions. I find it very easy, but if I had to rate it, it would be 100 out of 100." *Oakley*

"We've been doing negatives. That's when it goes below zero, like minus 1. We call it negative because if we say minus, they think it's subtracting. I enjoy it because I think I've learned something, and I'm better at maths now." Willow

"We been learning about decimals. I've been enjoying maths catch-up because I've been learning, definitely." Saul

"In the normal Maths, at the start there was a group going over the Year 3 stuff, and another group [doing investigations]. One group goes into the hall with Miss Day, and the other group are in Beacon class with Mr Tucker. *Jacob*

"In maths, we didn't actually used to have a video, but now we do. We watch some of the video and then we do the work. There's this voice which is showing us how to do things." *Ameleah*

Watching the video is preparing the children for being away from school, if they have to stay off for any reason.

Writing

"It's about doing things that we haven't done in six months, and learning what we have been doing over six months when we weren't coming into school, like writing stories. I wrote about a cowboy riding to town. I did that at home." William

"I enjoy it. We've learned that to make real sentences you don't use 'and,' and 'and then'." *Imogen*

"We've been fixing run-on sentences, for example: 'Kevin ran to get his ball and then he grabbed his ball but the dog grabbed it out of his hand and he dropped it and a car ran over his ball.' We put a full stop before the 'and', then cross out the 'and', and then put a capital letter to start the next sentence.

Catch-up has been a bit weird but its been really fun. I like it a lot." *Roman*

Mr Tucker says, "I have been impressed with how hard the children are working to catch-up after being off for so long. I have really noticed how children are writing more and clearly after just a few weeks of the writing catch-up programme. Children will have a chance to use this in their normal lessons as they resume after half term."



As we adapt to the new normal, it throws up other challenges. The winter months are coming and PE must switch to indoors. My thanks to the Victory Hall Committee who are allowing PE lessons to be held in the new Victory Hall. Our current hall is used to ensure distancing amongst older pupils and so this has had an effect on the PE arrangements. This is another example of the community working together for the benefit of our children. My thanks to them.

Village Agent News

Autumn is here and the winter flu vaccination programme is in full swing – it's especially important this year to get your flu vaccine if you are eligible for the free treatment, and maybe consider paying for one if you aren't. This year the flu vaccine is being offered on the NHS to:

- · adults 65 and over
- people with certain medical conditions (including children in at-risk groups from 6 months of age)
- · pregnant women
- people living with someone who's at high risk from coronavirus (on the NHS shielded patient list)
- children aged 2 and 3 on 31 August 2020, children in primary school & year 7 pupils
- · frontline health or social care workers

You can have your NHS flu vaccine at:

- · your GP surgery or local Hospital
- · a local pharmacy offering the service
- your midwifery service if they offer it for pregnant women

Somerset CCG are also looking at one-stop shop type locations where people can get Covid testing, flu vaccinations, Covid vaccinations & anti-body testing.

If you have your flu vaccine at a pharmacy, you do not have to inform a GP. It's up to the pharmacist to do that. Full details are here: https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/vaccinations/flu-influenza-vaccine/

Points from the Parish Council – October 2020

Shurton Defibrillator

Is now in place at the side entrance of The Babbling Brook Inn. The restrictions imposed by Covid-19 mean that promised awareness sessions into the use of the equipment for local residents are delayed.

One Somerset

The Leader of Somerset County Council, Cllr David Fothergill, joined the October Parish Council meeting and talked to councillors on the need for one unitary authority for the County, rather five new organisations as outlined in the alternative Stronger Somerset proposal. He referred to the opportunities and impacts on the Parish Council and for local services.

Victory Hall

Councillors were recently given a sneak preview of the newly completed Victory Hall and were impressed by the design and standard of the new building. The Trustees should be rightly proud of their achievement.

Slinky Bus

In mid-September the Slinky Bus service resumed to help those who live in the parish. Information has been shared with Stogursey News to help potential users register to access the service, which you will find on the next page in this issue. The more requests there are for service the better. It is currently limited to Wednesdays only for the parish, but if the demand from residents grows it will provide evidence for more service provision.

Community Noticeboard

A replacement community noticeboard is due to be fitted in place of the current noticeboard between the Corner Shop and the Bus Shelter in Stogursey during November. This will give community groups the ability to promote their services and provide a useful place for notices and information to be shared easily.

Many will probably have notice that the bus shelter and bench at Forge Corner has been given a facelift thanks to the work of volunteers from the local community and financial assistance of the Parish Council.

New Bridleway for Stolford

Somerset County Council have recently published the orders to install a new bridleway linking Steart Drove through to Wick Moor Drove. There will also be a new link on Gorpit Lane to the coastal bridleway. These improvements will eventually enable users to connect

with bridleways through Steart Marshes (to Combwich) and the bridleways around the HPC site linking into paths from Burton, Shurton and Stogursey.

Immy's Update

Following the latest Government guidance regarding Coronavirus, I want to keep you up to date with our approach to keeping the community and our workers safe.

Although infections levels in our region remain low, we are not complacent. We recently introduced extra measures on site to keep the workforce and community safe. Our testing regime and track and trace system have helped us identify cases early and to break the chain of infection. All new starters are tested before they join the project. Temperature checks, extra cleaning, social distancing and mask wearing all remain in force to prevent the spread of infection.

Now we intend to go further. We are increasing our testing capability so that we will soon be able to test workers returning from high risk areas. They will be able to get a test, and their result, without the need to leave their car. Anyone who gets a positive test result will be supported to safely transfer to self-isolation in line with the current Government advice.

Public Health England has recently commended the behaviour of our workforce. People have self-isolated as soon as they started showing symptoms, got tested and continued to self-isolate until their test results were known. Personal behaviours on and off site are of paramount importance and this is a key focus of our communication with employees. Our new team of "Covid champions" is now at work, helping to reinforce safe behaviours. However asymptomatic carriers may not realise that they carry the infection. That is why we are now introducing random testing as an extra part of our testing regime.

Covid-19 Update

Our existing protection measures remain in force and are working well. We have taken further steps to make mask wearing mandatory in more situations. This now includes workers moving around inside buildings as well as measures already in place for our internal and external buses. We are preventing infection using our own testing facilities, temperature checks plus track and trace measures.

Our workforce levels on site are defined by safety and our ability to maintain social distancing. Shift patterns, start and finish times, breaks and access pinch points are carefully planned and remain tightly controlled. In more confined work spaces, risk is assessed and PPE is used. Our buses still have reduced capacity and bus pick-ups and drop-offs remain focused on our park and ride sites.

We recognise that personal behaviours on and off site are of paramount importance. That is the focus of our internal communications campaign and our new Covid-19 champions are on site to support this drive. As well as our own inspection, safety on site will be overseen by the independent Office for Nuclear Regulation.

Hinkley Point C look ahead

November 2020



We carefully manage our works at Hinkley Point C, ensuring our construction activity has minimal impact on our neighbours. However, you may still see and hear some aspects of the work. This is a summary of some of our current works:

Loca	tion	Description of works
1	First Reactor	On our first reactor building, works continue on the In Reactor Water Storage Tank. We are also preparing to install the first Emergency Diesel Generator tanks. We have successfully completed the sixth and final concrete pour for the HKZ Column. The HKZ Column is part of the Aeroplane Crash wall and stands at 30m tall.
2	HGE Gallery	Now the Civils element of the HGE Gallery is complete, the MEH (Mechanical, Electrical & HVAC) team will begin their scope of work. This 305 metre gallery runs between the Raw Water Storage building and Unit 1/2, transporting the emergency cooling water.
3	Turbine Hall	Last month we talked about the TG Collumns which are being installed to support the Turbine Hall. The next stage will be to fill the columns with concrete.
4	Southern Infrastructure	Works continue to build the Emergency Access Road onto site. More information is available on the FAQ section on our website.
Off Site	Combwich Wharf	We have seen good progress on the removal of the Transfer Slab. Our focus for November will be installation of the piles. For more information on the refurbishment works, please visit the FAQ section on our website where a specific update is posted.
