

# **Good News from Stogursey Church Rooms!**

The Church Rooms Committee and the Parochial Church Council are very grateful to the Fairfield Charitable Trust for a Grant to cover the cost of upgrading the kitchen and toilet facilities in the Church Rooms. Plans are well under way, and we hope to have a new range cooker with extractor hood, a commercial dishwasher, a hand wash basin and a few other small improvements to the kitchen completed by early December. The toilet/washroom will have a complete overhaul, with modernised facilities for the disabled and a baby-changing station.

This upgrade will enlarge and extend the facilities offered to the community by the Church Rooms and will become a more versatile resource, a venue suitable for smaller, more intimate gatherings, with all its facilities to a high standard.

The first community group to put the improvements to use will be the Stogursey Community Network (SCN) who have been involved in the planning and resourcing of the upgrade. The SCN will use the kitchen to continue to produce home-cooked meals for certain local residents; these will be delivered hot to their homes by the volunteers. Once we move out of Covid-restrictions, the SCN plans to start a weekly Lunch Club in the Church Rooms. This will be run by volunteers on a monthly rota, and open to everyone.

Our local Environmental Health Department has given helpful guidance on Hygiene and Food Safety. All volunteers (and other user groups as appropriate) will be given training and advice on these important aspects.

More details will doubtless be given in Stogursey News and on the SCN Facebook when this becomes possible!

Of course, the enhanced Church Rooms facility will be available to all residents and groups in our area. The Committee is reviewing hire charges but rest assured that these will be reasonable and appropriate.

# A Christmas Tribute to Dulcie from the Sholl family

Every year our family knew that Christmas was well on its way when Dulcie's card arrived - it was always the first, so last year we were concerned when no card came. We knew she had been unwell and were relieved that she was able to talk over the phone, just saying that she felt tired, but her bright voice was still there and she wished us all a Happy Christmas...

We were very lucky to have had Dulcie as our home help at the Vicarage for many years, certainly most of the time that we were there from 1953 – 1974. She became an important part of our lives, unfailingly cheerful and enthusiastic, completely reliable, very good at her job and a real tonic to have around.

Each of us remembers different things about her. Sarah remembers her once in the kitchen with Mum, listening to 'Music While You Work' whilst trying to control vast amounts of soapsuds pouring out of the top of the old washing machine and Dulcie making short work of the quarry-tiled kitchen floor afterwards. Some years later when Sarah was playing the piano, Dulcie asked her why she didn't 'do something interesting like My Old Man's a Dustman' instead of that classical stuff'- a good question which didn't get an answer!

Caroline remembers going with Mum to visit Dulcie in Lime Street just after Francis was born, and, another

time. Dulcie laughing with Dad about the time she found straw in his bed; life was never dull and she told it straight -

In the 1950s we had an elderly family tortoise, originally called Ptolemy, then shortened to 'Tolly' and finally 'Torty' which was Dulcie's name for him - and it stuck. After Torty died and had been buried for some time Simon presented Dulcie with his shell which she always kept polished and would produce for us with great humour as a reminder of the old days, whenever we visited her.

Anna says that what she remembers most was Dulcie's loyalty, bright personality and energy, the contribution she made to our lives at the Vicarage and the great affection we all had, and still have, for her. She still lives on in 'Stogursey Voices' published by the Stogursey Oral History Project, where, with Kathy, she talks of her schooldays, early work, days out, and the pranks they got up to in those days when children would run free. She was a very popular part of Stogursey all her life and was, herself, one of the deliverers of this Stogursey News.

It was a joy for us to have known Dulcie for so long. Our thoughts and best wishes go to her family in what has been a difficult year. Thank you, Dulcie, rest in peace. We shall not forget you...

Last month's Stogursey News carried an application form to register for this service. Some of us are using it already.

Please note this change: we-can use Slinky, even if we have use of a vehicle.

Here is some information about the Slinky service.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS When does it serve Stogursey?

On Wednesdays from 9.45am to early afternoon.

#### Where will it take me?

To Bridgwater or Cannington.

#### Where do I catch it?

It's a door to door service. It picks you up from home, drops you off and collects you.

#### Does it have disabled access?

Yes it does.

### Is it free to register?

Yes it is.

#### What is the fare?

£3.50 single or £1.80 with a National Bus Pass or County Ticket Bus Pass.

£5 return or £2.50 with above Passes (Make sure your Bus Pass is up to date.)

#### What about children's fares?

Under 15s half the full fare. Children under 2 travel free. Please contact Slinky to find out more about seating arrangements for small children and babies.

### Can my child go to school or college on it?

Sorry no. It is not available for the school/college run.

# Does it operate during Lockdown?

Yes it does.

#### What COVID-19 rules are there?

The passenger limit is 7. In normal times it is 12. You must wear a mask unless you have an exemption. You must not travel if you feel unwell.

#### How do I book a trip?

Once Slinky Bus has confirmed your registration you can phone the booking office on 01749 880948 between 9am and 4pm.

### How much notice of a booking must I give?

You can book 2 weeks and up to 48 hours ahead.

#### What if I need to cancel?

Please give at least 24 hours notice of a cancellation.

### How do I pay?

You pay the driver.

### How can I get another registration form?

Phone the Slinky number or download one from the website below. You will also be able to collect one from Stogursey Post Office

#### Where do I send the form?

# **Nottingham Knockers**

a message from Avon and Somerset Police

There have been recent reports of "Nottingham Knockers" operating in several Sedgemoor areas. These are cold callers who usually tell residents that they are ex-offenders trying to go straight, then try and sell poor quality and over-priced cleaning products, they may also offer services such as roof repairs, driveway repairs and cleaning. The police want to remind residents they are under no obligation to answer the door to anyone they don't know or aren't expecting. If you do talk to them, they are supposed to be able to provide a valid Pedlar's Certificate and should leave your property when asked.

Remember with the current ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, you cannot guarantee a safe distance or cleanliness of any purchases made.





# Points from the Parish Council November 2020

#### **Castle Street Flood Alleviation Scheme**

The Parish Council have agreed to engage a contractor to cut back vegetation and to clear debris and silt from a section of the watercourse and the overflow pond to assist in moving water safely through the area. They continue to seek the support of riparian owners throughout the parish in clearing their waterways.

#### **Public Space Protection Order**

There have been several incidents over recent months of anti-social behaviour reported to the Parish Council. Whilst we have asked in the short term for more Police patrols to reassure those affected, the Parish Council agreed to seek a Public Space protection Order from the District Council to help minimise future incidents as such orders can give enhanced enforcement powers to the Police. If agreed it could apply throughout the parish in all public spaces.

## **Planning Matters**

The Parish Council have been informed that the appeal against the refused planning application for 70 houses on land off Shurton Road, Stogursey is to be held in Bristol in early February 2021.

#### Covid-19

## **Somerset Climate Emergency Community Fund**

The County Council has established a fund for bids from Parish and Town Councils. Qualifying projects will include those to reduce carbon emissions, reduce consumption and to implement activities around climate change mitigation and adaptation. The Parish Council have received a presentation on a West Somerset wide community car scheme using electric powered converted vehicles and are considering how best an application may be made to the fund for support for local initiatives.

### The Gravel, Stogursey

The Parish Council are considering enhancements that could be made to the area. They hope that by the time Stogursey News is published the power socket for the Christmas lights, damaged earlier in the year by a stolen vehicle, will be repaired and that the Christmas lights will hopefully be glowing into the New Year.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on the Zoom platform again. Members of the public are invited to attend and should contact the Clerk for details. ## **News from the Quantock Medical Centre**

I'm sorry we cannot share any Christmas exciting activities with you this month, and our Social Prescribing Groups (Walking, Singing, Art etc) have come to a standstill with Covid this year. I just wanted to share a few things with you this month to help things run as smoothly as possible.

Dispensary collection times are Monday to Fri 10am – 12 noon, and 4pm – 6pm. This is a great help as it reduces regular interruptions to the Dispensary team and they are able to process medications and complete their orders safely. If you really are unable to pick up during these times, you need to call and let Dispensary know so that they can make alternative arrangements. We have a great team of volunteers delivering to house-bound patients around Stogursey, Shurton, Burton, Holford and Kilve and of course Nether Stowey - thank you.

**Seasonal Flu Vaccinations**: if you are aged over 65 years, or you are under 65 years old with a medical condition, you are entitled to a free seasonal flu vaccination. If you fall into either of these groups please phone the Surgery on 732696 to check and book an appointment.

If you feel unwell and call the GP or NHS111, they may ask you if you have a blood pressure monitor at home. This is a really useful piece of medical equipment you can buy (approx. £30) and keep in your home to use, as well as a pulse oxygen monitor (pulse oximeter approx. £20). This is particularly helpful if you are concerned about leaving your home, and reducing your risk of picking up a virus.

If you are **self-isolating or need extra support**, contact:

Somerset Coronavirus helpline on 0300 790 6275 to be put in touch with local groups who can help with fetching shopping, medication and other essentials supplies, as well as other mutual aid. The helpline is open 7 days a week between 8am and 6pm.

Covid Vaccinations At the time of writing this, the plans for vaccinating communities have not been confirmed. However we will be expected to work with the Bridgwater Practices in the first instance, and patients will be expected to travel to a vaccination centre in Bridgwater or Taunton. Patients are likely to be vaccinated in age groups of higher risk first. You will receive a letter from Central Government when the plans have been agreed, and we will communicate with patients as soon as we are able to, and try to work with NHS to make sure our population's health needs are met throughout this campaign.





# MACULAR SOCIETY EXMOOR SUPPORT GROUP

The Macular Society has given millions of pounds from our membership fees, donations and legacies to support research into 'beating Macular Degenerations'. The main universities involved are: Southampton, Moorfield in London and Birmingham University. Though it will take some time till these efforts will come to fruition and become available to MD patients, first research and test results sound promising. Let me tell you about some of them:

- Work is going on to create a cell culture for each patient.
   The patient's skin cells are used as they are the closest to the cells of the macula (the central part of the retina).
   There is security that the patient's own cells will not be rejected.
- Once the skin cells have multiplied, they will be injected into the macula, where they are expected to continue to multiply and restore the patient's vision. This research project is at stage 3 (the last stage) of rigorous testing with thousands of sufferers. We all hope that this research project will be available within 3 to 5 years, once all tests have been concluded and funding has been approved by NICE, the Government's arm of the NHS.
- Scientists are researching the possibility of correcting the genetic predisposition of sufferers of MD, which is hereditary. The researchers are seeking to eliminate the MD defective gene and replace it with a healthy one. This treatment, it is hoped, will be available in ca. 10 years.
- For the near future, Bristol University are developing a Smart Phone App for patients, who have to go into hospital to find out whether they need another Lucentis injection in order to stop bleeding into the macula. This is timeconsuming for patients and ophthalmologist and clogs up hospital waiting rooms. This new App, once approved and downloaded on your Smart phone, will take a picture of the back of your eye and will send it to your ophthalmologist who will read it and let you know whether indeed you need another injection.

There is much hope and excitement about all this ingenious research work. For now at least, we can count on the help, advice and support of the Macular Society and their Support Groups, to cope with the condition.

We have every reason to be optimistic knowing that so many people are working on our behalf.

# **Project Progress**

Our approach to managing the challenges of Covid-19 means we've been able to continue making good progress on the Project in 2020. # **Covid-19 Update**

Against the backdrop of a further national lockdown, we recently introduced extra measures on-site to keep the workforce and community safe.

Our testing regime and track and trace system is in place to identify cases early and to break the chain of infection. We are increasing our testing capability so that we can test workers returning from high risk areas. They will be able to get a test, and their result, without the need to leave their car. Anyone who gets a positive test result will be supported to safely transfer to self-isolation in line with the current Government advice. We are also thinking ahead and planning for the return to work in January.

Personal behaviours on and off site are of paramount importance and this is a key focus of our communication with employees. Our new team of "Covid Champions" are now at work, helping to reinforce safe behaviours. As we all know, asymptomatic carriers may not realise that they carry the infection. That is why we have also introduced random testing as an extra part of our testing regime.

As another year comes to an end, we want to thank you all for your continued support through not only the good times but also the challenging ones. It's certainly not going to be a year any of us are going to forget quickly (even if we may want to!).
