We will miss Mrs Wall, Mrs Stark and Mrs Cavill a great deal. They have all been a very important part of the school community for many years and we wish them all the best for the future. It was a very difficult end to what has been a difficult year. We look forward to being able to say goodbye properly by inviting them back in September for a much more fitting farewell.

On a positive note, we are delighted that we have secured funding to offer wraparound care for the children attending our school. This has been an ambition for some time, and are delighted that the Happiness Breakfast and After School Club will start in September. We hope that this will be a valuable resource to families of Stogursey and we are very grateful to the Fairfield Trust for their support of this.

I look forward to a new school year with optimism, and I am looking forward to spending more time in school and much less time on Zoom.



Points from the Parish Council Meeting - 10th August 2021

Growing for Health and Well Being

The Parish Council has been awarded £10,344 from the Somerset Climate Emergency Community Fund as the turn down of our bid in the autumn of last year has been reviewed. This will enable the planters, which have looked fantastic this year, to be replaced with water retaining versions for 2022; enabling some improvements to the allotments and working with parishioners to help them grow their own vegetables. Councillors Helga Staddon and Chris Ford will be leading the working group formed to deliver the project.

Paddons Farm

Strongvox are intending to use the land on the right of the entrance once again as a compound whilst they construct the remaining properties for which they have permission to build. The Parish Council is concerned that this yet again holds up the transfer of the land to it and is trying to ensure that any disruption is kept to a minimum.

Neighbourhood Plan Working Group

The group are at a stage where consultation with parishioners of all ages is needed ahead of a questionnaire being delivered to all residents of the parish. It is intended that pop-up consultations will take place, probably at some of the usual events or gatherings across the parish. SO if you get the chance please do share your views on the future of the parish with the team.

Stogursey Arts Festival in September

The Parish Council agreed to install the multicolour lights used on the Gravel to enhance an installation being placed there for all to see and appreciate. Hopefully you will have the chance to see some of the Festival's presentations.

Flood Online Reporting Tool

The Flood and Water Management Team at Somerset County Council (SCC) are interested to know if your property in Somerset has been affected by flooding. The Flood Online Reporting Tool (FORT) has been developed to report any type of flooding that may have affected your property in the past or future events. News from the Quantock Medical Centre

I don't know why, but I always find it difficult to know what to write about and what people will be interested to hear, so this month I am going to update you on a few issues.

You may have heard recently the sad news that Victoria Park Medical Centre Bridgwater has had to permanently close due to lack of clinical staff. This will have a huge knock-on effect to all the patients registered there, and the surrounding Bridgwater practices are working extremely hard to support these changes and to provide care for these patients.

We, too, as a practice are finding it increasingly difficult to find locum doctors and nurses to support the practice when our Clinical staff book a much needed break. There are some weeks when we are operating on very minimal staffing levels and only able to see urgent onthe-day patients – so please be supportive of your local practice and bear with us.

In order to support the doctors, we have asked our very experienced and qualified Advanced Nurse Practitioner, Helen Every, to step back from general Practice Nurse duties to work alongside Dr Stone and Dr Klein using her skills and knowledge to see patients with minor illness: assess, diagnose, treat and prescribe. We will also be recruiting a new Lead Practice Nurse to support the nursing team.

You may have noticed some empty shelves in supermarkets, and heard about the shortage of lorry drivers across the country – we too have noticed a knock-on effect with dispensary deliveries and stock. Many drivers have left their pharmaceutical delivery jobs due to low pay, long hours, etc, and we have noticed in recent months fewer deliveries and less stock. This in turn has a knock-on effect on our dispensary team being able to fulfil your repeat requests in 48 working hours. Again, please bear with us we are all doing our best.

We would like to remind everyone coming into the practice to continue to wear face masks as Covid is still about and we need think about the safety and care of others as well as ourselves. A polite reminder that if you have any symptoms of Covid including a high temperature, a new continuous cough, loss or change to your sense of smell or taste, please organise a PCR test – please do not book an appointment with a doctor first, as it is a viral illness we are unable to help you with, and you will risk passing it on to more vulnerable patients at the Surgery.

Last, but not least, please book your 'flu vaccination appointment at the medical centre on 01278 732696. We will be holding clinics from mid-September through to October for all patients in a clinical risk group including: asthma, COPD, chronic lung conditions, heart disease, kidney disease, liver disease, neurological disease, learning disability, weakened immune system, BMI over 40, diabetes, all aged over 50 years old, pregnant women, carers and close contacts of immunocompromised patients.

The Government have not yet announced plans for covid boosters, so we need to go ahead with our 'flu plans as a priority.

Andrew's Update

The project has continued to make excellent progress throughout the summer months and at the end of July we safely achieved the second major goal of 2021 – the completion of tunnelling work on Hinkley Point C's outfall tunnel.

Emmeline, the largest of our tunnel boring machines has now successfully completed her work to dig a 1.8km tunnel, 24m under the Bristol Channel. The outfall tunnel, working in parallel with the two additional intake tunnels, will act as part of the wider water cooling system. It will take water away from the power station and back out to the Bristol Channel.

Launched from a deep shaft in August 2020, Emmeline has been operated by three separate shifts around the clock with the support of the HPC Marine Works team. As part of the tunnelling activities 100,000 tonnes of earth has been removed and 1,206 concrete rings installed – that equates to 9648 individual tunnel segments.

The completion of the outfall tunnel marks an important step forward in our construction activities as we near the end of our tunnelling works which will be so vital in future operations. Once dredging is complete next year, we will see the installation of water intake heads in the Bristol Channel.

Looking ahead, our third goal of the year will be the installation of the second containment building liner for unit 1, followed by our final goal of the year – the first mechanical and electrical installations within the reactor building itself.

Hinkley Point C - Monthly Update

A round up of the latest news from Hinkley Point C.

The Round Britain Climate Challenge

UN Ambassador Sacha Dench recently stopped in at Hinkley Point C as part of her epic circumnavigation of mainland Britain on the Round Britain Climate Challenge. Known as the "human swan", Sacha is travelling over 3,000 miles around Britain in an electric paramotor, attempting to earn two Guinness World Records- the fastest and first flight around Britain by this method.

During the visit to Site Sacha met with members of the HPC team as well as Professor Tom Scott from the University of Bristol to learn more about the important role HPC will play in Helping Britain Achieve Net Zero.

Construction Progress - Tunnelling and Steam Generator Systems

The second of our four major goals for 2021, the completion of the power station's outfall tunnel has now been completed. Since the beginning of the Spring, the team have tunnelled 1.8km, 24 metres below the Bristol Channel

The first tanks that will support the operations of the steam generator blowdown system have also been installed within the first reactor building. Lifted into place by Big Carl, the 16-tonne tank is the largest installed by the MEH Alliance so far. It is the first of 10 which will need to be installed across both reactors in the years ahead.



Team members from the Balfour Beatty Marine Works Team spent an afternoon with Stowey Green Spaces Group helping to make Stowey Woods more accessible. The team repaired a wooden bridge, built a whole new set of steps up through a slippery path and cleared an over grown path.

Joined by HPC Chaplain, Ewen Huffman, the team got stuck in to support the Stowey Green Spaces Group and have made a visible difference to the woodl and wider area.


