
This month we plan to start half-an-hour earlier and run a workshop for beginners and for those wishing to improve their techniques.

Stogursey Arts Trust

"If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together."

African proverb

In the first few years of its revival, the Festival established itself quickly as an Arts event on the cultural calendar of West Somerset. Those of us who were part of this reinvention had no idea that it would be so well-thought of so quickly. Every year following, we came up with new ideas and the Festival went from strength to strength. In March 2020 we started to meet to discuss the sustainability of this annual event, only to be stopped in our tracks by the pandemic. Literally the morning after we met in the Church Rooms to discuss our strategy for going forward, we had other more important things to be concerned with. Yet despite the frustrations and anxieties that followed, individually we kept the conversation going.

None of us are any younger, but many of those who continue to run events, manage village resources or organise activities are in the demographic that could be described as 'the Last of the Summer Wine'. There is still an energy here, but we recognise there is a dilemma, one that has been rehearsed in the past with the disappearance in time of events and activities such as Stogursey's pantomime and the village coach trips. More currently, the temporary closure of the very popular Soap Factory Cinema, due to Covid, prompted many to ask 'will it start up again?' As for the Festival, the distancing restrictions required us to promote a DIY response to the display of work that has continued into this year.

In recognition of the importance of keeping events alive in around the parish, the various organisations that are still going strong, came together last month to see if we could find some common ground to support one another and encourage new interest and volunteers.

The good news is that 14 of our local community groups turned up, some with longstanding track records for recruiting new generations of interest, spanning over several decades. In comparison, the 'revived' Festival is still in its infancy and learning from others. We are three years off the decade milestone, but seeing the strength in working with other village groups over the years, such as the flower 'artists', the music gala, the school, the Church and the fantastic number of creative residents in the village, gives us hope and food for thought in what happens next. This year we saw some of our local musicians organise stand-alone events of real quality. In other areas within our community new offers of expertise

have enabled quality concerts to be performed in the church and we also saw a new take on the Well dressing, resulting in a beautifully crafted piece by our flower artists. All this alongside the DIY Outside Gallery and the highly successful, reinvented Flower Show.

It is clear that for us 'to go far' or just keep going further, with more of us working together we may just be able to sustain the activities that people enjoy as part of village life. We also have some new suggestions from the 'post it' ideas gathered from the joint village coffee event last month. These have been grouped below for you to consider:

continuing Donna's story, as first reported in a 1987 edition of Stogursey News



Points from the Parish Council Meeting 14th September 2021

Paddons Farm

Strongvox were represented at the Public Forum and several posed questions on the state of the drains on the estate which were promised to be CCTV inspected and the results shared. The building of the remaining 27 houses should commence by the end of the year the meeting was told, but that disruption would be kept to a minimum and the old compound reinstated, which would also house contractors' vehicles. The other parcel of land would be transferred to the Parish Council and all work is intended to be completed well within two years.

Housing Needs Survey

It is hoped that a questionnaire will be distributed around the whole parish by Somerset West and Taunton Council to gauge the needs within the parish. I am sure there will be more on this topic as the matter progresses. If necessary, please do not hesitate to ask for assistance.

Community Safety Officer

Nicola Hale, the newly appointed Community Safety Officer for SDC and HPC introduced herself and outlined her role to the Parish Council. She hopes to be able to assist in resolving any Community Safety issues being experienced by members of the parishes around Hinkley Point.

Highways issues

Many will have noticed that many of the worn out white and yellow lines are being replaced following concerns raised with SCC Highways by the Parish Council, hopefully more will be addressed as the weeks pass. One issue which has been highlighted since the yellow box junction was renewed on the High Street, in Stogursey, is the need for all drivers to appreciate the needs of other road users. The yellow box has been repainted, it's not new; it is there to help motor vehicles access Lime Street safely, please keep it clear. The Police have said that they will pay attention to the area and deal with individuals as and when required.

The Community Speedwatch team are working with the Parish Council to hopefully obtain some speed indicator devices for use across the parish. These will help educate drivers about their speed and provide evidence for targeted Police action, if the speeds recorded are too high for the road they are deployed on at the time. It is hoped that SCC Highways will support our request and work with us to help reduce the likelihood of speed-related incidents on our rural, narrow roads.

Defibrillator replacement

The Parish Council have agreed to replace, after four years of availability, the defibrillator currently situated on The Gravel between Stogursey Motors and The Corner Shop. The other two units, in Shurton and Stolford, were newly installed in the last year, hopefully none will ever be needed, but if they are please do not hesitate to use any one of them.

Well Dressing at St Andrews Well, Stogursey

In many parts of the country there is a tradition of dressing local springs and wells as a way of giving thanks for a supply of fresh clean water.

This year a group decided to try and construct one of the traditional display boards most often seen in Derbyshire, to display at St Andrews Well, with a European-style flower arrangement on the approach to the well.

The well dressing is made from live plant material pressed into a base of damp clay set into a purpose-built frame. The frame was set with screws to help hold the clay, and soaked in water for 24 hours. The clay was dug locally and trampled and cleaned to make it malleable. It's a very messy process! Once prepared, the clay is put into the frame and smoothed down.

The picture of a tree, fields and stream, was drawn full-sized on paper and the outlines pricked through onto the clay. The outlines are marked with coffee beans. Then

over a couple of days, a team of people came with plant material and built up the picture bit by bit.

The dressing doesn't last very long as the clay dries out in a few days.

Jenny Nicholson and Liz Moorsom had the idea and got the project going. John Nicholson made the frame; Rosemary Nock, Wendy Ball and Hilary Burland provided materials and worked on the picture. Chris Moorsom made the coffee to sustain everybody. Lisa Dunwood and Jo Logan made the displays on the approach to the well.





Vicki's Update

A crucial element of the power station istaking shape ready to support the world's largest turbine generator - the Arabelle turbine.

Last week the blue 16-metre-high Turbine Generator (TG) columns were topped with newly installed 'spring-boxes' ready for the turbine hall 'table' to be constructed. These springs work in a similar way to shock absorbers on a car, dampening the vibrations from the turbine so that it does not carry down the columns into the raft below.

The turbine is the engine of the power station, taking steam from the Reactor Building and converting it into electricity. The rotating turbine shaft is directly

connected to a generator rotor which generates 1.6 gigawatts of electricity. The two reactors at HPC will supply enough low carbon electricity for 6 million homes.

The next stage of the works will involve raising the decking to the underside of the table, just above the springs., 532 tonnes of steel reinforcement will form the beams across the top of the columns whilst 1,200 embedded plates will be fitted with pinpoint accuracy.

To finish the table, a 2,500m3 continuous concrete pour will take place to create the 70m by 20m platform.


