


The weekly Stogursey Lunches are offered in the Church Rooms every Tuesday. The Lunches are open to all, do come along! Payment is by donation.

Gardening Tips for November

Collect seeds from your flower heads, such as Sunflowers, Cornflowers and Nigella. Make sure that they are dry, then store them in a paper bag in a cool, dark place. (Monty Don)

Put 'pot feet' under your terracotta pots to lift them off the ground. This allow them to drain easily in winter rain and frost.

Sow Seeds

Sow broad beans. and garlic into the soil. Sow sweet peas in pots in a cold greenhouse or cold frame.

Stogursey Community Network Volunteer Medical Transport UPDATE FROM NOVEMBER 2021

Our volunteer drivers can take you to a medical appointment, including doctor, dentist, optician, physiotherapy etc, if you are unable to get there any other way.

This service will continue in the future, but please note the following important information:

- Transport is provided for medical appointments only, no shopping, etc can be considered.
- In order not to disadvantage any passengers on the grounds of income/resources, passengers are requested to make a discreet cash donation for the transport. This amount should be what passengers can afford and feel is appropriate for the journey. Those who can afford more will be helping others on more restricted incomes, for which we are all grateful.
- With effect from 1st November, donations will be collected by the drivers in small paper envelopes which will be provided. The donations will therefore be anonymous, if so desired.
- Passengers should ensure they have the donation ready when they are collected by the driver.
- The use of the collection tins in the village shops for these donations will no longer be required or expected.
- Passengers are politely requested to respect the rules of medical transport only, and to try to ensure that adequate notice of appointments is given to the Transport Coordinator, in order to ensure that we are able to provide an efficient service to all.


Understanding the world

At Stogursey School the classes have all been learning about the world – about its history, geography, its plants and animals. On Monday afternoons, all the children are Stogursey adventurers where they do practical lessons inside and out.

In Beacon class the children are learning about the planet earth and its biomes which are large areas of the planet with different vegetation, soil, climate, and wildlife. The younger children are learning about minibeasts and the autumn.

In Triscombe class we have been studying medieval history – four hundred years from the Norman conquest until the Tudors came to the throne. We learned that during that time, women couldn't be the monarch – it was always the oldest son who became the next king. We do not think that was fair at all!

During the Norman conquest, William the Conqueror came from Normandy in France and defeated Harold, the Anglo-Saxon King, at the Battle of Hastings









We are delighted to report that we met for the first time at the end of September at our new venue, THE COMMUNITY ROOM, in Dulverton (just by the entrance to the Doctors' Surgery carpark). We are so lucky and grateful that Adelaide from Magna Housing secured it for us for the foreseeable future.

Our first visiting speaker was Holly from Somerset Sight, one of the oldest charities in the country, a most valuable one for people of all ages with sight problems. They provide us with practical, technological and emotional support, offer home visits to read our mail or newspaper to us, and to give us lifts to ophthalmology appointments. They also help us to set up our computers with listening devices, so that we can hear what we can't see; more often than not, they rescue us when we can't read instructions how to get us out of a muddle.

All through the Covid lock-down, Somerset Sight staff made sure that none of us was facing problems for long or was lonely in our isolation. Now that we can all get together again, they are organising social events again at their headquarters in Taunton. If you need support, advice or company due to your failing eyesight why not give them a ring on 01823 333 818. They also send a van every three months to Dulverton (Exmoor House car park) where you get the full service and can buy helpful gadgets like talking wrist watches, speaking bedside and kitchen alarms, magnifying glasses, thick writing pens. Holly brought a large selection to our meeting, and we shopped! All profits goes to the Charity.

Points from the Parish Council Meeting 12th October 2021Paddons Farm

The saga of Strongvox and the transfer of land to the Parish is no clearer or nearer. There have been mixed messages from Strongvox in recent weeks and it looks doubtful if the transfer will happen before 2023 at least. The good news for residents appears to be that at last they have acknowledged the issue with the drainage on the estate and that it will be rectified.

Housing Needs Survey

It is hoped that by the time you read this that this important questionnaire will be distributed to all households and businesses across the parish by Somerset West and Taunton Council. Highways Issues

The Parish Council was dismayed to hear that the volunteers of the Community Speedwatch team are being abused by some drivers as they carry out speed survey work in the Parish. The good news is that they are recording all the registration numbers of those who fail to recognise the importance of complying with the speed limits putting others at danger and passing the information onto the local police.

Neighbourhood Plan

The working group has received a welcome boost as it has been awarded $\pounds 5,868$ in government funding to progress their work. Steve and Nigel, along with all the

other volunteers and Councillors on the group, are resuming work to progress the plan to the next stage. Hopefully an update on their work will follow soon.

Five into One – The new Unitary Council for Somerset

Parish Councillors are coming to grips with the decision by the Government for the four District Councils from across Somerset and the County Council to come together into one new Unitary Council in 2023. There is a joint working group carrying the ground work, outlining the many changes and opportunities that will arise to processes and services. The group intends to update Councillors and Parish Clerks as well as residents as it progresses. The change will bring forward local parish and unitary council elections to May 2022.

A lot of work and many announcements will follow in the coming months and we will try to keep you as informed as possible, as the changes become clear.

How do we apply?



SOMERSET APPLE CAKE

The recipe comes from 'The Complete Farmhouse Cookbook' from the Yorkshire TV series.

Ingredients

85g /3oz butter 170g / 6oz caster sugar 1 orange rind, grated 225g / 8oz self-raising flour 450g / 1 lb Bramley apples, peeled, cored and cubed (about 1 - 2 cm in size) 2 eggs, beaten 2 tablespoons milk About 1 tablespoon demerara sugar

Method

1.Grease and flour a 23cm/9 inch cake tin.

- 2.Cream butter, sugar and orange rind, and beat until light and creamy.
- 3.Mix 1 tablespoon of the flour with ³/₄ of the cubed apples.
- 4.Put eggs and milk in bowl with the creamed butter.
- 5.Add remaining flour, and floured apples to the creamed mixture and blend well with a metal spoon.
- 6.Turn into the cake tin, arrange the remaining ¼ of the cubed apples on top.
- 7.Sprinkle the top with the demerara sugar.
- 8.Bake in a moderate oven, 180°C /Gas 4 for 40 - 50 minutes until golden brown.

Serve cold a a cake, or warm as a pudding with cream.

Vicki's Update

After 5 years of construction, significant progress has now been made on what will be the heart of the power station, the reactor building for Unit 1. The reactor building will house all the main reactor components which include:

- The reactor vessel- containing the nuclear fuel and where the nuclear reaction takes place. This is the heat source.
- Four Steam Generators that take the heat from the nuclear reaction and produce large quantities of steam which is used to drive the steam turbine.
- Four Coolant Pumps that circulate coolant water. This water stays within the reactor building.

The containment building is made up of three layers of protective barriers, two of which are over a metre-thick and made from reinforced concrete. Together with an inner steel liner, they protect the environment in the event of an accident. The shell is also designed to withstand the impact of a commercial airliner.

The team have recently completed the second major pour on Unit 1's inner containment wall, this is the concrete structure that sits just outside of the 230 tonnes of steel that forms the inner steel liner.

Looking ahead, the focus on Unit 1's reactor building will be the lifting of the second containment ring liner into place. The liner ring is the second of five pieces that make up the inner steel containment and is a key step to the completion of the whole building.

Hinkley Point C - Monthly Update

A round up of the latest news from Hinkley Point C.

The 29th of September marked five-years since the final contracts were signed and the construction of Hinkley Point C was given the official green light. Since 2016, thousands of people and companies have been employed on the project and significant milestones have been achieved including a number this year:

- **Reactor-** The next 17m high concrete section of the first reactor building has been prefabricated and is ready to be lifted into place by Big Carl.
- **Turbine Hall-** Work to build the 16m high floor for the first turbine and generator is under way. It will support the world's most powerful "Arabelle" turbine which arrives later this year. Each turbine can produce more than 3% of the nation's electricity, enough for more than 3m homes
- **Cooling tunnels-** 3.5 miles of cooling tunnels have been completed and six 5,000 tonne water intake heads are ready for installation.
- Mechanical, Electrical and Heating- Work to install the 230 miles of pipes and 5,500 miles of cables is underway
- **Skills-** Training for the first cohort of power station operators has begun.
- **Grid connection-** The country's first "T-pylons" have been installed for the station's 35mile grid connection
