



Points from the Parish Council Meeting 14th June 2022

Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

The Parish Council was pleased to have been able to support, by way of grant funding, many local events taking place over the extended Bank Holiday weekend in early June to celebrate The Queen's reign. Thanks must go to all those volunteers who gave up their time and organised the various events, which were so well done and hopefully well received by those who attended.

St Andrew's Well

The Parish Council is keen to engage with the owners of this historic feature of the parish as there are concerns that it is in need of structural repair. Enquiries to identify an owner are drawing a blank and Councillors are worried that if the structure deteriorates access will be restricted. If any of our local historians can assist with identifying the owner please get in touch.

Highway Issues

It is pleasing to note that many of the potholes and missing road markings across the parish have been repaired or repainted. If you spot something, please report it to Somerset Highways www.somerset.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/report-a-pothole-or-road-defect/

Bus Back Better

The Parish Council was very disappointed that the county has not received a sensible level of investment in local bus services. The Parish suffers from a lack of bus service provision and the future looks bleak as the funding awarded will barely keep the services between the main towns, let alone offer any support to the rural communities. The Bus Back Better group are seeking support for everyone to make one journey, or part of a journey, by bus to show their support for the future of public transport. It appears to be a case of use it or lose it.

Parking

There is work being undertaken to ensure the Parish benefits from targeted funding for increased local parking facilities, as EdF is seeking to invest up to £75,000 in four local parishes which are struggling with parking issues. There needs to be evidence gathered to help support the Parish Council's stance that the parish needs to receive funding to enable enhancements to be made and to help relieve issues, especially in the High Street and Burgage Road/ Vicarage Road areas of Stogursey. Hopefully more on this next month.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on Tuesday 12th July 2022 at 19:00 at the Victory Hall. All are welcome to attend

Planning a journey in Somerset? Think Travel can help

A new one-stop travel information website has been launched by Somerset County Council to support more local people to access public and community transport.

News from the Quantock Medical Centre

We are very proud to announce that a special medal has been awarded to Helen Every, our Advanced Nurse Practitioner from Diabetes UK. Helen was given the award for living with Type 1 diabetes for 50 years.

Helen was diagnosed when she was 9 years old. Type 1 diabetes is an autoimmune disease which develops when the body attacks its own insulin producing cells. It usually affects children and young people, but can develop in older age.

Helen has been injecting insulin for 50 years. She says she has experienced many changes in the management of her condition, from boiling glass syringes and metal needles (which became blunt and painful!) in a saucepan to sterilise them, to using insulin pens and Flash Glucose Monitoring.

Helen has been working as a nurse for 42 years and went on to support patients with both type 1 and type 2 diabetes. When she applied to undertake her nurse training, she had, unbelievably, to fight discrimination because of her condition.

Alan Nabarro, whom the medal is named after, was diagnosed with type 1 diabetes in 1922, and was given six months to live. Fortunately, insulin was discovered in 1923 and he was able to successfully manage his condition over the following 55 years. He spent his career fighting discrimination for people living with diabetes. Helen says, "I am happy to say that there are additional medals for those who have successfully lived even longer with diabetes." Marine works

This summer the Bristol Channel will see significant activity as six concrete intake heads, each weighing 5,000 tonnes, will be placed onto the seabed ready to be connected to the cooling water system.

Each of the six structures will be lowered into place by two of the largest marine cranes in the world, operating in tandem from barges bigger than a football pitch. This work presents a huge engineering challenge and a major milestone for marine works.

Shurton 400kV substation energised by National Grid

National Grid is celebrating a key milestone in the construction of Shurton substation, with the successful energisation of the facility. The substation sits adjacent to the Hinkley Point C construction site and is now transferring energy from Taunton substation to Shurton. Later this year it will also back feed electricity to support the construction of the new power station. Once Hinkley Point C is completed, Shurton substation will connect the first new nuclear power station in a generation to the UK electricity network – connecting 6 million homes and businesses to low carbon energy.

Vicki's Update

This summer the concrete structures manufactured at Avonmouth will complete their journey to the bottom of the Bristol Channel, playing a safety critical role in ensuring the cooling water system can operate. The six concrete Heads, constructed at Avonmouth by Balfour Beatty Marine Works team, rank among the most complex concrete structures ever built in the UK. There are two types, two Outfall Heads and four Intake Heads, which will sit on the Bristol Channel seabed, connecting to the three tunnels (one Outfall and two Intake) mined by our Tunnel Boring Machines.

What are they for? The Heads are the inlets and outlets for the cooling water system for Hinkley Point C's two reactors, and they have been designed to exacting levels of complexity to ensure they can continue to do this task in all conditions. These designs took six years to perfect. Considerations included the difficult conditions they would operate under, as the Bristol Channel has the second largest tidal range in the world. Because the Heads are a critical safety element of the Project, the design needed to consider all eventualities including ship impacts and a 1 in 10,000-year seismic event.

How were they built? After dozens of concrete pours – each Intake Head's construction required 11 individual pours using concrete that had gone through more than 100 trials- the six Heads finished construction last year. Reaching this point meant an exceptionally complex reinforcement design had to be followed. The density of the steel was so high – two to three times above a general civils build. With a nuclear specification and tight positional tolerances, every single bar in each of the Heads was checked with a quality process involving four separate parties.

How will they be placed? Each of the six structures will be lowered into place by two of the largest marine cranes in the world, operating in tandem from barges bigger

than a football pitch. This work is a huge engineering challenge that represents a major milestone for marine works.
