

SUPPORT THE SOUTH WEST CLEAR UP PROJECT

Some of you who've lived in Stogursey a while may have seen our younger son Greg cycling around the village aged ten on his unicycle. Well he's now 23 and just back from a two-and-a-half-year break in Australia. He set off on a three month holiday in February 2020 but got stopped in his tracks, thwarting his onward travel plans to visit Bali and then do a trek in the Himalayas (as I did in my twenties.)

On his return he was struck by how "cute and small" everything seemed to him – and I don't think he meant his Mum! Unfortunately, he was also struck by the increasing amounts of litter everywhere, and announced to me the following morning that he'd set up a project on Instagram @SWCLEARUPPROJECT encouraging people to pick up litter as soon as they see it – as well as to not actually drop it in the first place.

I know a lot of us do this as a matter of course already. I usually have a large carrier bag on me (in addition to my smaller bags for the dog) which is frequently full of litter by the end of a walk in the local area. I think with Instagram the idea is to post a photo of you and your litter pick – or just the offending articles.



The photo shows a bumper crop from the Castle moat area. It's quite a sight to see me flat on my stomach 'fishing' with the dog's ball thrower! What is worse is all the recyclable litter on the ground and in the village bins – pity we haven't yet got more recycling friendly litter bins.

I mentioned putting something in Stogursey News about Greg's project and he dictated the following: "the basic idea of the project is to normalize picking up litter and to denormalize littering – essentially to just encourage people like you and me and the everyday person of the area to pick up litter and try and keep the area spotless as it should be cos the litter just does not belong here – it shouldn't be there and is completely out of place. We need to keep the South West beautiful and pick up litter. Start picking it up. Stop putting it down."

He's had some stickers printed as a reminder to others - so look out for them!

Appointment System

From September 2021 and due to unprecedented pressure and demand, we were forced to cease the availability of pre-bookable GP appointments. All GP appointments can only be booked on the same day. The surgery implemented this change as the demand has led to a waiting time of 4 weeks for a routine appointment. Many patients find this unsatisfactory and there have been increasing occasions where the receptionists are being subjected to inappropriate comments which is unfair and unacceptable. Having all 'on the day appointments', allows for all doctors to deal with what comes through on that day and give patients reassurance that they will not have to wait a month for a consultation.

We have not taken this decision lightly, however, we have to ensure that our team remain healthy to be able to provide services to you. We want our patients to be reassured that our consultations will continue to be a mixture of telephone calls and face to face.

vaccinated. If you cannot access the NHS App, please call 119 and they will be able to provide you with a paper version. Please do not call the surgery, as we are unable to provide you with one.

Did you know that you can order your repeat prescriptions online?

If you have an NHS account, you can order repeat prescriptions using the NHS website or the NHS App from a smartphone or tablet. If you prefer not to use the internet, please use the printed slip that comes with your medication to place your next order. Please allow 3 working days and only tick the items that you require. Order Monday – collect Thursday; Order Tuesday – collect Friday; Order Wednesday – collect Monday; Order Thursday – collect Tuesday; Order Friday – collect Wednesday.

We would prefer you to use the above methods to order your prescription, but if you do need to order over the phone, please use the dedicated phone line, 01278 655464, which is open 9.30am – 12.00pm Monday to Friday.

If you have not received a text message within 3 days of your request, please contact us to check the status of your prescription before coming to collect. Prescriptions can be collected anytime from 8am – 1.30 and 2.00 - 6pm Monday to Friday. During this time we are unable to dispense controlled drugs or answer any medication queries and you will be asked to return to the surgery during the dispensary opening hours.

Covid Booster Information

Most people have had their COVID booster, but some people will require a fourth. If you have been told you are eligible to receive a fourth dose, please book an appointment via the Government website or by calling 119. As a practice we are not providing this service, and we are unable to assist with any booking requests.

Avon and Somerset Police NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING Rural Affairs Unit

We are aware there has been a concerned and perceived fear of an increase in theft of fertiliser nationally since the conflict in Ukraine, but the Avon and Somerset Rural Affairs Unit would like to reassure our rural communities that, at this time, we have had no significant increase in reports of theft of fertiliser.

The items most likely to be stolen are trailers, plants and

machinery; items less likely to be stolen are Fences, livestock, firewood and fuel; and items unlikely to be stolen are feed, fertiliser and cables.

Did you know, rural crime can be reduced using Watch schemes?

By using your knowledge and awareness of what is happening on and around your land, you can help to reduce crime and deter criminals. cont'd on next page

We are encouraging all our farming communities within the Avon and Somerset area to sign up to our successful rural watch groups – Farm Watch and Horse Watch – which are both free to join! The schemes are a partnership between police and communities to reduce crime and provide an early warning system for the farming and equine communities. Suspicious people and vehicles can quickly be reported to the police and we can send live updates, alerting members of theft or criminal activity in the area.

PROTECTING RURAL PROPERTY - WHAT CAN I DO?

Farm and plant vehicles

Fit tracking devices on your agriculture and plant vehicles. You can also mark them using security or forensic markings. Check with your insurance provider as some will offer discounts once a tracker is fitted. Lock your vehicles and plant in secure outbuildings or containers. Record vehicle and machinery serial numbers and take photographs for reference. Secure your vehicle (quad and ATVs) using suitable locking

devices and fixed ground anchors, secured to the floor using the correct gauge in security chains and padlocks. Protect your vehicles, trailers and plant by registering them on the Immobilise Property Register. Fit a key safe, so keys to vehicles are kept in a secure place. Remove all GPS from your machines when not in use and store securely. Ensure all trailers are fitted with a good standard wheel clamp and hitch lock.

Livestock, equipment and tack


Carry out regular counts on all your livestock, maintaining concise records of your stocks and tag numbers. Make a note of any distinguishing marks or features on your livestock. Consider the use of wildlife cameras if you keep your livestock in isolated areas. Mark all tack with your postcode using metal punches, engraving tools, or forensic marking. Photograph your tack, keep a comprehensive list of all items.

However, it often is a big shock to the patient and heralds a change of lifestyle: we can't drive, read a book or newspaper, watch television, write letters, go for walks on our own; it's safer to walk around with a white stick to warn motorists; and often, we can't even recognise our family and friends because their faces look to us like blank surfaces. Hence our Macular Society support group.

Therefore, our members are, like all MD sufferers, dependent on others to take them out and make us feel part of 'the living' as one of our members put it so succinctly after our latest excursion. Rosemoor and Valley of the Rocks, here we come!

Village Agent News

What is a Village Agent?

CCS Village Agents are local, problem-solving solution finders. There are over 60 Village Agents all over Somerset.

Sounds interesting but WHO can they help?

A Village Agent can help if....

- •You are an unpaid Carer or looking after someone else informally & need a little help & support for you and the person you care for.
- You are struggling with a problem, big or small, but don't know where to turn.
- You are feeling lonely and isolated.
- •You are part of a community with a collective problem & need a kick start to solve.

It doesn't matter how big or small the problem is, CCS Village Agents are here to help.

If you receive help from Adult Social Care, you may be referred to a CCS Community Agent, who works directly with referrals from the ASC team. They are very similar to a Village Agent but may have different experiences and knowledge in specific areas, such as mental health or learning difficulties. All CCS Agents work closely with local GP surgeries and the Adult Social Care team, so a person has well-rounded, co-ordinated support.

but HOW exactly can a Village Agent help?

It's very difficult to pin down exactly how a Village Agent can help, as each person's situation is unique. In short, they can help make life better with the right connections, and practical community-based solutions. Here are a few recent examples of how they have helped people:


- Source & arrange delivery of white goods, furniture & household items to people in need.
- Made sure that the clients are supported to get the financial help they need.
- Conducted welfare calls on behalf of local GP's to ensure clients are safe and well.

Don't forget that there is now a *Small Grants programme* awarding funding of up to £5,000 to charities, voluntary groups and social enterprises that normally operate on less than £100,000 each year.

Hinkley Point C - Monthly Update

A round up of the latest news from Hinkley Point C.



Hinkley Point C Gears up for a Summer of Heavy Lifting



Heavy lift crane "Gulliver" has arrived offshore of HPC site

Hinkley Point C is preparing for another spectacular engineering feat with the precision placement of 5,000 tonne cooling-water intakes on the seabed. Four times longer and twice as high as a double-decker bus, each intake head will be connected to five miles of tunnels used to circulate cooling-water for the new power station. The first heads have been carefully loaded onto barges at Bristol Port's Avonmouth docks, ready to be towed out to meet two floating heavy lift cranes "Gulliver" and "Rambiz" which will work in tandem to lower the

structures into place.

Each platform is the size of a football pitch and the cranes have a combined lifting capacity of 7,300 tonnes.

The four "intake" and two "outfall" heads have been built by Balfour Beatty in Avonmouth. Each "loading out" operation, carried out by lifting specialists Mammoet, takes several hours, with the water levels being adjusted at the dock, to ensure the barge can receive the load safely and securely.

The group were given a tour of Hinkley Health where the team shared their experiences of working on site and explained how the centre is making a difference in alleviating pressure on local NHS resources by providing the workforce with ready access to GP, physio and

nurses and the on-site covid vaccination clinic. Professor Whitty was also keen to hear about the extensive mental health support available on the project. The group met with HPC's Lead Chaplain, Ewen Huffman, who explained his role in providing a listening ear to the workforce. They also met with representatives from the project's Mental Health Buddies scheme, which is making such a positive impact across the site.
