Stogursey Arts: Festival UPDATE

The Festival begins Sunday the 4th September alongside the Stogursey Flower Show and runs through to the following weekend.

The Garden Sculpture Trail is sponsored by Fairfield and involves commissioned, local artists, who over the past month have been making sculpture specifically for a number of selected local gardens. Most of the gardens are at the front of the chosen sites and can be accessed during the week, much like the 'Outside Gallery' that we ran through the lockdowns. Some, where access is needed to the rear of properties, will have a schedule of opening/closing times and you should check on the details, which are published in Stogursey Motors window. All visitors are respectfully requested to be mindful of their own health and safety and be considerate of the host gardeners and the sites where this is applicable.

At the time of going to press we are hoping that there will be other sculpture in gardens in and around Stogursey and that everyone will join in and make 'things'.

Sculpture by pupils from Stogursey School, made from recycled materials, will be exhibited centre stage on the Gravel.

As a last minute reminder, if you haven't supported the annual 'Lighting Up of Stogursey' in the past, it's dead easy, just put your Christmas lights out and have fun making a creative display for others to enjoy when you switch them on at dusk.

Look out for the surprise **Yarn Bomb** celebrating 'growth': clues to the location of this collaborative 'garden sculpture' will be posted in Stogursey Motors.

The Church will be open all week to an exhibition of 'Garden/Flower Sculptures' by our Flower Festival artists.

There will be a number of *FREE* (with the exception of the Soap Factory screening) evening events in the Jubilee Rooms, which are all scheduled for a **7.30pm start**. We welcome donations in support of the Arts Trust at these events, which have been organised for the benefit of the community and parish.

Not sure what the Stogursey Lunches are? ... or how they work? Possibly interested in joining our volunteer team?

What?

Stogursey Lunches are 2-course, home-cooked meals served at 12.30 pm every Tuesday in the Jubilee Rooms. The meals are for local residents who book in advance (on the Friday before the Tuesday). The food is varied, and wherever possible uses local, fresh produce.

How do they work?

Stogursey Lunches are staffed entirely by volunteers. Each meal is prepared by a cook and an assistant (who have taken and passed the Level 2 Food Hygiene & Safety for Catering course). The front-of-house person serves the dishes (and helps set up and clear away afterwards); the driver/deliverer takes meals to the homes of those who are unable to attend in the Jubilee Rooms; and the overall session is guided by a supervisor.

What are the costs?

The only costs are the ingredients and the donation to the Jubilee Rooms for the use of the kitchen and premises. Diners are asked to make a cash (or cheque) donation of their choice; ie, what they feel the meal is worth, and can afford to pay.







Volunteering Opportunities

We need more **Cooks**, **Assistant Cooks**, **Driver**/ **Deliverers** and **Front of House** staff. It's a great team of people, and the service we provide is hugely appreciated and enjoyed by our diners.

Are you able to spare a few hours on a Tuesday once a month or so?

If you're interested in trying it out, we can arrange for you to 'shadow' a Driver/deliverer or Front-of-House volunteer, or to be an assistant cook for a session. If you think that it is for you, we can provide training, including the Level 2 Food Hygiene & Safety for Catering.

Do you fancy finding out more without committing yourself yet?

Come along to our Open House at **11.15 on Tuesday 6**th **September** in the Jubilee Rooms, enjoy a coffee, some cake and a chat with current volunteers and find out for yourself.

- We are always grateful for donations to our Foodbank collection box (outside The Rectory), but please note that no medicines, fizzy drinks or food past its Best Before date can be accepted.
- If you need food assistance, either contact the Village Agent (for a Foodbank referral), Home Start (families) or us* for something from the Stogursey Larder.
- SCN Medical Transport volunteer drivers can take you to a medical appointment, including doctor, dentist, optician, physiotherapy etc, if you are unable to get there any other way. Payment is by cash donation.
- SCN volunteers will collect your medical prescription and deliver it to you at home if you are unable to get to the Surgery or the Spar/PO to collect it. Just ask your Surgery to add your name to their list.

QUANTOCK U3A is a friendly group of retired and semi-retired people with a zest for life who are willing to try new experiences. Live, Laugh, Learn!

It was good to see so many members and non-QUANTOCK u3a members at our meeting on 25th July in Kilve Village Hall. Thank you Kilvites for making us so welcome. Our speaker was Sue Briggs of Diabetes UK. Sue was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes when she was 53. This is unusual as it is usually diagnosed in childhood. Her talk was inspiring, and demonstrated how far medical technology has come in treating Type 1 Diabetes.

The meeting is intended to start with a presentation on the proposed bridleway/cycle path from Steart to Stolford/ Wick



Vicki's Update

I wanted to take the opportunity in my update this month to share with you the very exciting 'Somerset's Wilder Coast' project aimed at working with local people, community groups and businesses to help preserve and protect local marine and coastal nature recovery. I include below a call to action from the Project Manager, Mark Ward, who is particularly keen to work with individuals and groups within Stogursey Parish.

Somerset





SOMERSET'S WILDER COAST

HOW TO GET INVOLVED IN PROTECTING SOMERSET'S WILDER COAST - A CALL TO ACTION.

Our coast and seas are constantly under threat from human disturbance, coastal development, pollution, and climate change. To help address this, Somerset Wildlife Trust's new 3-year 'Somerset's Wilder Coast' project funded by the HPC Community Fund was launched at the start of April. This will be building on its previous, successful Somerset's Brilliant Coast project. There are lots of ways local people can take part.

Mark Ward, the project manager, and his colleague and project officer, Mandy Wallington, are keen to talk to any local individuals, community groups, businesses, schools, youth organisations or partners who would like to get involved.



The project will aim to establish at least eight self-organising local **Wilder Coastal Communities**, giving them opportunities to take a proactive role in marine and coastal nature recovery and equipping them with the skills, resources and knowledge to record, monitor, improve and increase coastal (and connected terrestrial) habitats. Although we are working along the whole Somerset coast, we are particularly keen to support and engage with parishes close to Hinkley C. We already have some possible ideas for ways we can work with communities around Stogursey, Shurton, Burton, Knighton, Wick and other adjacent parishes. Some of the ideas were explored during our earlier project but were curtailed or shelved due to the pandemic. For instance, we would love to get people involved in surveying and monitoring cliff top plant communities, devising some real or virtual nature trails to help people find out more about some of the special species we have in these habitats. We could also develop an inter-generational project – connecting older, less mobile, local residents to the coast and their memories of it using young people and children as a link to help collate and share their memories. We would be interested in using the creative arts (art, drama, poetry) and well-being and nature connection activities to celebrate this unique section of our coast.

We already have good links with other partners such as WWT at Steart and Quantocks AONB who we would work closely with to develop these or any other exciting projects you may have.

We will also be working with a network of **Wilder Schools** across the county, through our recently launched **Somerset School Coastal Champions Award** (set up with our partners from **Litter Free Coast and Sea – Somerset** and **Carymoor Environmental Centre**). This will include offering accredited training for teachers and youth leaders in the delivery of **Wild Beach** environmental activities. There will also be support for on-site wilding of school grounds to build strong connections between young people and their environment and to inspire new generations to understand the ecological value of the Somerset Coast and its interconnected terrestrial and freshwater habitats.

We really hope that you and your community would like to engage with us to make this project a success, as well as supporting the Wildlife Trust's wider aims to get more people actively engaged with nature and to develop a nature recovery network across the county – both land and sea – that will allow nature to thrive in the face of the many threats it increasingly faces.

We would love to meet you (virtually or in person) to explore your ideas.

Hinkley Point C - Monthly Update

A round up of the latest news from Hinkley Point C.



Heavy lift crane "Gulliver" has arrived offshore of HPC site




Hinkley Point C Marine works- what's next?

Hinkley Point C's marine works continue through the summer with heavy lift crane "Gulliver" carefully lifting the four cooling water intake heads onto the seabed ready to connect to five miles of tunnels used to circulate cooling-water for the new power station. Soon "Guilliver" will be joined by another heavy lift crane "Rambiz" and the pair will tandem lift the two much larger outfall

heads and lower them into place. Once placed, the highly complex engineering operation takes place to connect the intake and outfall

head structures to the tunnel. This starts by a drilling rig boring vertically through the centre of the head structure itself creating a vertical shaft in line with the horizontal tunnels already completed. Once this vertical tunnel is complete a "connection" tunnel will be constructed. Valves and connections already installed would then allow the area within the vertical tunnel to be dewatered allowing the final connection to be made between the tunnels before the temporary lining is removed and the system flooded ready for operation.

New dawn as Hinkley Point B ends generation

After more than 46 years of generating low carbon electricity for the UK, Hinkley Point B station has stopped generating power. The station has helped the UK avoid the emissions of more than 107 million tonnes of carbon dioxide. Mike Davies, Station Director of HPB said "There is much to be proud of. This tiny corner of Somerset has produced huge amounts of zero-carbon electricity, supported and enriched our community and helped sustain the South West nuclear sector by providing thousands of well-paid, high skilled jobs to our community."

St Peter's Church, in Stolford, has undergone a major refurbishment after being awarded over £37,000 from the HPC Community Fund. Stogursey Parochial Church Council was awarded the grant to help improve the facilities of the building to enable it to become the Stolford & Wick Community Hub, providing a much-needed resource for the two rural communities which until recently had no space where the community could come together. The Revd Andrew Tatham, Project Leader said: "The project has the aim of enabling, strengthening and supporting the community, not only through the construction phases of the power station, but on into the future, thanks to a grant from the HPC Community Fund."
