Badger Vaccination is expanding across Somerset (and the South West)

It's been another incredibly busy year as a volunteer with the Somerset Badger Group (SBG) vaccination teams, as more landowners are signing up to vaccinate instead of culling their badgers. SBG has been working with farmers and landowners from across the South West for over thirty years and have been running their vaccination program for the last ten. With more farmers coming over to vaccination it means that open conversations can be had between them and our experienced teams about the role badgers actually play in bTB transmission.

Science tells us that badgers can only play a very small part in the spread of bovine TB with cattle continuing to account for almost every case of infection cow to cow (over 94%) with the rest 'unknown'.

The government's own bTB surveillance data also concludes that culling badgers has had no effect on

reducing bovine TB in cattle. Instead, incidences of bTB reduction were due to cattle measures implemented either before the cull ever began, or during the cull period.

The focus needs to be on cattle and cattle-based measures: better cattle testing, cattle movement, effective slurry management, additional biosecurity and of course, cattle vaccination. And although a cattle vaccination is the most effective, fastest and long term solution to the bTB problem, there is still no approved cattle vaccine licensed for use at this time but the APHA who are field testing at the moment say that one could be deployed in 2025.

I for one am very pleased to hear the change in narrative happening here in Somerset and beyond. Badgers play an important part in our ecosystem.



BRIDGWATER CARNIVAL CONCERTS - SET TO RETURN TO THE STAGE

A round up of the latest news from Hinkley Point C.



Hinkley Point C's Polar Crane Beams arrive from Switzerland

The Polar Crane Beams for Unit 1's reactor building have arrived on site after making their way from Switzerland. The beams came via the Rhine and Rotterdam before being delivered into Combwich Wharf and moved up the C182 by a police escort. These beams form part of the large crane that will operate inside the reactor building playing a crucial role in maintaining and refuelling the nuclear reactor during operations. The beams will be housed temporarily in a facility on site along with the other components required to build the crane. A protective structure will be built to allow the

Polar Crane to be assembled away from the elements. Once complete, Big Carl will lift the entire 800-tonne crane into the reactor building, forming one of the last pieces of the jigsaw before the reactors domed roof is lifted and placed on top.


