Your kindness and well wishes have truly made a difference to us, and we thank you all from the bottom of our Hearts.



#### **News from Cannington Health Centre**

#### **Dispensary**

You may be aware of online pharmacy services which appear in NHS digital mobile phone applications or as websites offering to supply your prescribed medicines via the post. While you can choose to use any dispensary to supply your prescription medicines, there are a few considerations when using online pharmacies:

- You cannot have any face-to-face contact with an on-line pharmacy. They can only deal with patients by post, telephone or by internet, not in person.
- Your prescription will be delivered by Royal Mail, unlike your medications handed to you in the dispensary by a member of our team.
- In October 2015, an online pharmacy business was fined £130,000 for selling its patients' details to marketing companies.
- In February 2017, the Care Quality Commission inspected an online pharmacy business and found that it was "not safe, effective or well led".

We believe that an internet pharmacy business is no substitute for your local dispensary.

We have several options how you can order your prescriptions, but as we are a dispensing practice, we are unable, unfortunately, to dispense to you if you live within a mile of a pharmacy - as the crow flies.

- You can order your prescriptions for collection from the surgery via the online NHS app (please contact the surgery for information).
- You can phone us on our dedicated repeat prescription line which is open between 9.30am 12pm Monday-Friday
   01278 655 464 which is operated by a dispenser who will be able to help with any queries you may have.
- You can drop off your repeat slip at any time.

We aim to complete prescription orders within 72 working hours, and we will contact if there is a supply problem with any medication.

Please support us to continue caring for you and your family by ignoring any correspondence from an online pharmacy business, and by continuing to obtain your prescriptions here at your local NHS dispensary.

#### Flu vaccinations

Flu vaccinations are well underway. If you are eligible to receive a free flu vaccine, please phone 01278 652335 and book an appointment. Where possible, we ask that you phone after 2pm.

Please note, we are unable to offer COVID boosters at the practice, to book for a COVID vaccination, please call 119.



# EXMOOR SUPPORT GROUP, DULVERTON

We had a most wonderful visit from Jo
Fishwick, the leader and organiser of all the Macular
Society Groups in the West Country. Apart from the fact
that she stepped in at short notice, because our original
speaker cancelled in the last minute, Jo told us all about
and demonstrated the most recent developments in
technology for the blind, most of which she uses daily
herself, as she is totally blind. Our thanks go to her, her
ever patient husband Rob and guide-dog Bruno.

As we are nearing the end of the year, I thought I announce the last two events together.

We are delighted that the Leading Ophthalmologist at Musgrove Hospital in Taunton, Mr Edward Herbert, has agreed to visit our group on Thursday, 24th November, to explain, particularly to our new members, the origins, diagnosis, and treatments of Macular Degeneration; and tell us a little bit about his own, fascinating career, before bringing us up-to-date with the efforts made by his colleagues in research and their already considerable successes. We are very lucky and most grateful indeed, that Ed has fitted us into his already packed schedule at the hospital.

We usually don't have a meeting in December, but if members would like to meet up on December 8th at 11am at the carpark close to Hannover House, Dulverton, the Somerset Sight van will be there to tempt us to buy more helpful gadgets and to replace batteries where needed.

# Points from the Parish Council Meeting - 11th October 2022

Due to the period of national mourning following the death of HM The Queen, there was no Parish Council meeting held in September.

#### **Parish Councillor Vacancy**

Are you interested in becoming a Parish Councillor? The Parish Council is the first tier of local government and aims to be a strong voice for residents and local businesses, working to improve the overall parish area. If you are interested, please contact the Clerk or any of the Parish Councillors to find out more about the role and how you may be co-opted on to the Council.

**Shared Cycle Path – Combwich to Hinkley Point** 

There was a presentation on the proposal from HPC to create a shared cycle path on what is currently the network of footpaths from Steart to Hinkley Point. The proposal is to change the paths to bridleway and includes a surface path across the RAMSAR and SSI sites through which the footpath travel. The ongoing consultation may be followed by formal proposals, which the Parish Council may have to consider in due course.

#### **Hinkley Point B De-Commissioning**

A public consultation is currently running on their proposals, and a presentation is to be given to the November Parish Council meeting, when members will be able to raise queries and comment.

#### **Paddons Farm**

As the current phase of the development draws to a close, the future of the two areas currently being used as compounds will be considered, as those areas are due to come to the Parish once the works are completed. The future use of both areas will be considered at a future Parish Council meeting.

#### **Parking**

Since the last update there have been several meetings to try to build on an idea of an additional parking area on Burgage Road/Vicarage Road. It is hoped that Magna Housing and Somerset County Highways will consider the idea and help to relieve some of the issues that continue to occur in those areas.

#### **Road Salt**

If there are any of our community groups that wish to have a supply of bagged road salt (free of charge) for use over the coming winter months, can they please make contact with the Clerk.

The salt bin on Priory Hill has been cleared of rubbish and is now full of salt once more . . .

# Volunteer to be an Independent Visitor or Advocate for children in Somerset.

These are fascinating and inspiring opportunities, which can bring real benefits to vulnerable children and young people. (Travel and reasonable expenses are reimbursed.)

You can help children and young people understand their rights and ensure that their views, wishes and feelings are heard.

#### What is an Independent Visitor?

Independent Visitors are volunteers who befriend and spend time with a child or young person who is in the care of the Local Authority. By law all local authorities have to provide an Independent Visitor service.

In Somerset, our intention is to encourage the relationship between the Independent Visitor and young person to continue beyond care. This way the care leavers continue to benefit from support, while making the transition to young adulthood. Independent Visitors are highly valued by the young people as they may be the only person involved in their lives who is not paid to be there.

#### What is an Advocate?

An Advocate is an independent person who can offer one-to-one support to children and young people to have their voice heard when meetings are taking place concerning their wellbeing. It's the role of the Advocate to speak up for the young person, make them aware of their rights, listen to them and represent their views, wishes and feelings. Why not join our bank of advocates? You choose when you're available.

Your volunteering can be arranged to suit your availability. Your life experience will be highly valued and you will be trained and supported in developing key skills.

#### Vicki's Update

We are very proud to confirm that we have now reached our long-standing target of training 1,000 apprentices here at Hinkley Point C.

The work to make this milestone a reality started over 10 years ago in the planning phase of HPC, when we set out key socio-economic targets to deliver as much opportunity as possible to the local community and region. Thank you to those of you who were involved in these key discussions so early on.



The apprenticeship programme is making a real difference across Somerset, with two thirds of all apprentices living within the local area. Some examples include;

Charlotte Casey, 22, from Bridgwater graduated from her Nuclear Engineering apprenticeship in the summer and is now working as an Operational Development Engineer on site. "My course was action packed, with training in everything from nuclear science to safety and regulation," said Charlotte. "I've now secured a permanent job on the project, and my aim is to see Hinky Point C through to commissioning."

Mat Danby, 28 from Bridgwater is a Level 3 Chef apprentice with Hinkley Point C's catering provider, Somerset Larder. "Before I came here, I was frying chicken in KFC – and now I'm making meals for hundreds of hardworking people every day", said Mat. "The best bit about my job is the progression I'm being given – and seeing the workforce enjoying my food!"

Travis Redfern, 22, from Taunton is a Digital Engineer Apprentice with BYLOR. "I originally wanted to be a primary school teacher, but after hearing about Hinkley Point C's apprenticeships, I decided to change directions", said Travis. "I'm so glad I did – I'm passionate about the project and I'm learning so much. It's setting me up for the future."

Apprentices starting work at Hinkley arrive into a unique environment and it's a massive a project with endless opportunities to learn. We hope that our apprentices will look back at this part of their career positively, having been able to develop their skills and contribute to building our power station. We look forward to creating even more opportunities as the Project progresses.

### A round up of the latest news from Hinkley Point C.



#### Hinkley Point C reaches apprenticeship target ahead of schedule

At HPC we have now reached our goal of training 1,000 apprentices. The target was set during the planning stage of the project and is part of our commitment to maximising opportunities for local people. The apprenticeship programme's success is due to the extensive outreach work being done with local schools and colleges whilst partnerships have also been set up with training providers, such as Bridgwater & Taunton College, creating a pipeline from the classroom to employment.



The apprenticeship programme is making a real difference across Somerset, with two-thirds of all apprentices living within the local area. Apprenticeships will continue to be available on the project as construction develops. Due to the number of skills needed to build the power station, there is a course for everyone, from welding, nuclear engineering, to HR and catering.

Opportunities are available, regardless of previous experience, background, or age – the youngest apprentice is 18, and the oldest is in their 50s. More information on our apprenticeship schemes and how to access the huge range of opportunities is available on our website: edfenergy.com/hpc

### Biffa's fitting support for Ukraine

The Biffa team at Hinkley Point C's Waste Consolidation Centre (WCC) is lending a helping hand to Ukraine aid workers by donating PPE essential to road safety management. The 'boot sort' event in the summer saw the Biffa team and volunteers from across the Project pair the boots, then clean, lace and box them, ready to be transported to Aylesford, Kent.

They were then handed over to road safety charity Eastern Alliance for Safe and Sustainable Transport (EASST), which handled the shipment to Ukraine. The safety boots were sent out to search and rescue teams which work with local authorities to create safer road conditions in the war-torn country. Andy De'Ath, Biffa Operations Manager, said: "These materials and the PPE from Site would usually go into disposal. With this donation programme, we've taken one load of boots over to Kent already and we're aiming for a second soon. So far we've donated more than 200 pairs of boots and we're currently working with EDF's Environment team to increase our donations by expanding to other materials.
