Stogursey Arts Photographic Society

"Out of the Quantocks* into Stogursey, out of Stogursey into the Sea" *Anon*

We have taken the original quote, which said 'World'* and substituted it with 'Quantocks'

Our quote this month has been selected as a 'working title' for the SAPS exhibition, which the group have started working on in earnest. We felt the 'World' was just a bit too ambitious!

We want to build on the ideas behind the visual documentary work by early photographers, who recorded the local people and the area at the turn of the last century as camera technology evolved. We will reference the successful Stogursey Oral History Project, which we felt could provide some valuable starting points, as we begin to make our own photographic records.

At our January meeting we discussed themes, costs and some intentions, which could not only lead to our proposed exhibition, but also form the beginning of an ongoing 'social history project', illustrating 'The Village', its situation between the Quantocks and the Bristol Channel and how we see parish life now and current developments which point to the future.

The themes we identified are quite open at present, for example:

- The surrounding, significant landscape, near or seen from the village or towards the village.
- Portraits of local people, where they live or where they are at work.
- Significant landmarks, our homes, streets, our community buildings and places of work.
- Activities and gatherings, which make up the Stogursey year.
- Significant wildlife (flora and fauna).

Once we start to share and see ideas developing visually, we can begin to organise work into groups ready to curate the exhibition or exhibitions. To help keep each other informed of work in progress we are establishing a 'What SAPS' group.

In looking to the future, the team debated the frequency of exhibitions and concluded maybe twice a year would be achievable in the first instance.

This month's 15 minute visual presentations were introduced by Ken Arnold and Mike Bradshaw. Ken took us through the making of a fabulous piece of his work: a large print he had made from initial image capture, beautifully photographed on Exmoor and skilfully manipulated at home using Photoshop. The image, in black and white, had been 'cleaned up' using the computer software, enhancing the picturesque scene, its

textures and the drama of the original composition. For beginners it was a brilliant example of what can be achieved, and Ken has offered to help individuals in the group if they want to learn the software.

Mike had recently visited an exhibition of photography at Tate Britain, showing work by the late Bill Brandt. Brandt had sparked Mike's own interest in photography as a student back in the seventies. He had chosen Brandt's work to illustrate how close cropping of photos can abstract the 'figure' in photography. Brandt had created some brilliant photographic images of the figure, which looked as if they were part of a beach landscape. Legs, arms, hands and torso appeared as if they were pebbles or large rocks. He showed some earlier work showing the progression of Brandt's use of wide-angle lenses and large format cameras, and talked about the very obvious influence of Man Ray, the Surrealist artist and photographer (who Brandt had previously worked with).

Next month Dave Hathaway will be loaning his collection of local (photo) postcards to open up the evening's discussions. So if you are interested, come along and join in.

The next meeting is booked for **Thursday 9th February**, starting at 7pm in the Jubilee Rooms, Castle Street. There is a voluntary sub of £2 to cover running costs of the Jubilee Rooms.

Getting to Grips with Winter (Putting the Boot In)

You will no doubt have noticed the puddles and streams of water lining the lanes and roads and causing flooding. This surface water also masks the potholes and over time affects the tarmac and degrades the road surface. The overall result is deterioration of the road network leading to increased cost of maintenance paid for by you know who.

Surprisingly, in many situations there is a ditch with capacity to accept this excess. The nub of the issue is the mud and leaves blocking the 'grips'. These are the short channels linking the road to the ditch. The Highways Authority is responsible for the road network, and should regularly check the verges, but the heel of a wellington boot can often clear the problem.

Beacon is creating a fiery routine inspired by volcanoes; Alfoxton is inspired by places in Europe, and Triscombe has linked their dance to the local area - how lovely!

New Books to Read



Beacon Class began reading two new books: *The Dam* by David Almond, and *The Last Bear* by Hanna Gold.

Each of these texts have connections with the pupils' geographical learning for the spring term.

The Dam touches on how the natural landscape influenced the location for the construction of The Kielder Dam which helped provide an adequate water supply to surrounding areas.

The Last Bear looks into the impact of climate change and the plight of endangered species. These two texts will influence the Year 5/6 writing, leading to a high-quality explanation essay, news report and story (with a focus on setting description).

Pupils are enjoying the texts so far and are keen to apply their learning to their written work and can't wait to show off what they can produce.



NEWS FROM THE QUANTOCK FOODBANK

Plans for the **Mobile Pantry vehicle**, which is intended to go out to the various locations so that users do not have to drive to Watchet to choose the items in their Pantry collection, is progressing well.

Thanks to the most incredible donations from people in the Quantock area and a Heart of the Community award, the fund nearly covers the contract cost of both the chassis and the insulated van interior. There are still excess inflation costs to find plus a suitable base for the vehicle and installation of a charging point, but overall progress is good!

The Mobile Pantry vehicle will be coming to Stogursey in the Spring on its commissioning trials. However, the same system will operate on this as with the Foodbank i.e. those who are struggling may seek a referral from the usual agencies which include Job Centres, NHS services, Social Services, Village Agents, and others too numerous to name.

News from the Quantock Medical Centre

I want to start by wishing all our readers a Happy and Healthy New Year!

We have had a very busy few months seeing a huge increase in cases of Flu, Chest infections and Strep Throats. We still have Flu vaccinations available. If anyone over 50 years old would like to book an appointment please call reception on 01278 732696.

Unfortunately, Helen Every our Advanced Nurse Practitioner has had to step down from her role due to ill health. She has been an amazing member of our team since 2015 and helped so many patients over the years. I know her patients will want to say a HUGE thank you to her and we will be organising, with our Patient Participation Group, a Thank you event for her in March, so please look out for the date and time.

Our Patient Participation Group has been resurrected following all the lockdowns over the last 2 – 3 years, and we had a very interesting meeting in December with over 12 attendees at the Nether Stowey Library. If you would be interested in joining our group, or coming along to find out about what's happening, you are welcome to join us. We will be meeting at the Nether Stowey Library at 10.15am on the following dates: 15th February, 21st June, 13th September and 6th December 2023. We discuss many issues affecting the Health Service and our local Practice. We would also like to raise awareness about the variety of different health professionals we have working with us at the Practice.

We have a First Practice Physiotherapist (FPP) who is available for patients to book directly in to see him on a Tuesday afternoon, with any <u>NEW Musculo skeletal problems</u> (not to be confused with ongoing Musculo or Orthopaedic problems you are already being seen and treated for). He is able to assess your <u>NEW problem</u>, and treat you through: specific exercises, joint injections, organising X-rays and scans, and referring on to the Orthopaedic Team if required. If your NEW problem is likely to require physiotherapy support, you would be advised to book in with our FPP rather than see a GP as this will help get you seen and treated a great deal quicker.

We have a new Health & Well Being coach on a Wednesday morning at the Practice, who is able to spend time with you; exploring what you would like to change or improve on, able to find out what motivates you, and help you access services and groups you might be interested in. This process helps you look at all aspects of your health including your mental and physical health, and can help with pain management, weight management, loneliness and isolation, as well as getting fit and back in to being more active. To find out more about what Health Coaches are able to offer go to https://www.sasp.co.uk/ or call us and book into an appointment with our Health Coach.

I would also like to mention that we have been having a number of supply issues with obtaining medication stocks (as have the rest of the country) so we are requesting that patients order their repeat medications at least 3 working days in advance (not including weekends and bank holidays) in order for us to make every effort to complete your request. We hope you are able to understand and appreciate your support with this change.

I would also like to remind people that there are many ways to order your repeat medications:

Drop off your request to the Dispensary Box, or over the counter, these are collected twice a day. Doors to the surgery are open from 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday & Saturday 8.30am to 11:30am.



Andrew's Update

A very happy new year to all readers from the team at Hinkley Point C. As you may have already seen, the final weeks of 2022 were very busy with a number of key components lifted into place within the first reactor building. Big Carl lifted the final steel ring liner into place and the reactor building is now ready for the installation of its iconic domed roof

In the final days of 2022, more progress was also seen away from the site. The first nuclear reactor built for a British power station in more than 30-years was completed and is now ready to be delivered to Hinkley Point C after teams spent 80,000 hours on its construction.



ABOVE. Hinkley Point C's Reactor Pressure Vessel. It will contain the nuclear reaction that will provide 3 million homes with low-carbon electricity.

The "reactor pressure vessel" is the high strength steel cylinder that contains the nuclear fuel and the chain reaction needed to make heat. The heat is used to create high pressure steam for the world's largest turbines. At just 13m long and weighing in at 500 tonnes, each of two reactor pressure vessels at Hinkley Point C will help power around 3m British homes. They are designed to run continuously for 18 months at a time between refuelling.

The reactor has been built in France by Framatome; the same nuclear engineering company which built Britain's last nuclear reactor, at Sizewell B in 1991. Since it went into operation in 1995, that reactor has provided 247 TWH, which is enough to power every home in Britain for 2 and a half years.

The centre of the reactor will have an average temperature of around 300°C and can withstand five times more pressure than a submarine at normal operating depths.

The completion of the first reactor pressure vessel marks a major milestone in the construction of Hinkley Point C. Together, the two nuclear reactors will offset 600-million tonnes of carbon dioxide emissions over its 60 year lifetime – driving Britain towards net zero and stronger energy security.

There is also change to the team here, and I would like to take this opportunity to welcome Stacy Walker, the projects new Stakeholder Relations Manager. Stacy joins us from the United Kingdom Hydrographic Office, lives locally and will be a great addition to the team. Stacy will take on future newsletters and I am sure will introduce herself in the next edition. In the meantime, Stacy can often be seen running the local hills and will likely see many of you at future events and community meetings.

2022 End of Year Film

2022 was a year of substantial progress and success at Hinkley Point C. Amongst a wealth of milestones we saw the completion of the power station's water-cooling tunnels, delivered a hugely complex marine engineering operation successfully placing the seawater intake structures into the Bristol Channel and opened our reactor simulator and training centre.

In the final weeks of 2022, Big Carl lifted the final 11-metre prefabricated steel ring into place and added key internal components to the reactor building itself. Hinkley Point C's first reactor building now stands at over 40m and is ready for the installation of its iconic domed roof.
