"When words become unclear, I shall focus with photographs. When images become inadequate, I shall focus with silence." *Ansel Adams*

The SAPS met in early February to review where we were up to with our gathering of images. Towards the end of last year, we had discussed the potential of developing a website to enable those who had access to a computer to follow our progress with photographs, in addition to the 'words' we use in our monthly contribution to Stogursey News.

In leading this month's discussion, Andy had taken the best photos from those we had shared through our WhatSAPS group and had begun to set up a prototype for a website, for the group to discuss. We gathered around a welcome log burner, and a TV screen Andy had set up to show the photographs. It was great to see all of the images together for the first time, collated under subject titles. This simple and effective vehicle for organisation enabled us to discuss the clarity in what we saw and in what we had achieved over the past year. Looking forward, it also gave us some pointers as to how our endeavours maybe be interpreted in our planned exhibition.

It was great to see that we had passed the Ansel Adams critique. Our images were far from inadequate, the combined collection of our photos was not 'silent'. There are some great images, telling great stories, recording both present and past Stogursey, but our task now must be to cover any gaps and get on with publishing them.

Viewing the work on the TV screen helped in identifying our approach to this next stage. We decided that we would begin by adding all our edited images to the website and as we get closer to the opening of the exhibition, we will use the screened/projected images to collectively review and select the photographs we will use for the show. We can then collate, print selected images and create a coherent display that everyone can access even if they don't have a computer themselves.

The website will also, eventually, be accessible to all 'our followers' who have access via a computer. Once it is up and running, we will let you know the details, so you can see the SAPS portfolio of recent images and the archive we have collated from past examples.

Building on the creative successes of contributors to the Christmas Tree Festival, we will soon be approaching these groups and others, to make a visual record, a portrait of these important individuals who work together and form the groups at the heart of our village life.

It is free entry for everyone.



In addition, SCN volunteers collect **prescriptions** from the two local Health Centres and deliver these to the SPAR/POST OFFICE for collection. If your Surgery has designated you a housebound or home delivery patient, we will deliver to you at home. (Note: This is only for patients who are unable to collect from the Surgery or the SPAR/PO.)

The SCN is an official outpost of the Quantock Food Bank and Pantry. We collect and deliver food bags to families and individuals, as required. We are always grateful for donations to the Foodbank collection boxes in our two village shops.

Somerset Council – Financial issues

The Parish Council is monitoring the issues that the financial problems of Somerset Council may bring to services in the Parish that they currently provide. The possible cuts in the number of recycling centres, the cut to the school crossing patrol budget, which may impact the service provided at Stogursey School, cuts to highways budgets and the impact that may have on roads and verges throughout the parish are just some of the areas that top a very long list of services that are being scrutinised by Somerset Council. By early March the position may become clearer for the coming financial year, and the Parish Council will be able to further assess the impact of changes at its next meeting.

Remembrance Day – Service on The Gravel

The Parish Council is researching the implications that seeking a road closure order may have for the organisers of the service held annually on The Gravel. The next meeting will further consider information from their insurers, as well as the advice and guidance from the local Police and Somerset Council in respect of such events.

There is still a vacancy for the role of Councillor to join the Parish Council which can be filled by co-option of an individual who is a British subject, on the electoral register of the parish, is over 18 years of age and is not disbarred from standing. First transformer delivered

The first transformer has recently been positioned into the Electrical Building. Out of the planned 14 transformers, seven are now in position ready for installation. Once in use these transformers will increase high voltage power to 400V and will link to the National Grid, providing power to various areas and buildings throughout the Site.

Chemistry Team happy in new science lab

Our dedicated team of chemists are celebrating after moving into their own science lab at Hinkley Point C, with its own testing equipment and computer systems.

The team are looking ahead to commissioning, and in the meantime, will take on work that might have gone to an off-site testing facility.

Hannah McIntyre, Acting Chemistry Lead, said: "This is a big milestone for us. Initially, our work will involve supporting teams here with hydrotesting and analysis."

As we move into commissioning, the team will be responsible for looking at hundreds of samples a day, for example when testing the purity of the water we use to flush our systems."

Update on Hinkley Point C

As you may have seen, we now expect the first reactor to be in operation around the end of the decade. Rising costs for civil construction and running the project for longer means it will cost more but there is no impact for UK consumers or taxpayers, as the costs are borne by the project's shareholders.

Going first in building a design adapted for UK regulations and restarting a nuclear industry after an almost 30-year pause has been harder than anticipated. Like any other nuclear developer, we have had to substantially adapt our design to meet British regulations, making 7,000 changes, adding 35% more steel and 25% more concrete.

Building something for the first time is hard, but repeating an identical design with the same people and suppliers is easier. We know this through building our identical second unit, which is typically 20-30% faster. Now the detailed design for the fit-out phase is complete, we know what we need to manufacture and how much time it will take.

Turbine Hall Crane installed

At the end of 2023, the 300-tonne crane was successfully installed into Unit 1's Turbine Hall. Built by Fayat in France, it will combine with the secondary 70-tonne winch section and travel on rails along the top of the Turbine Hall. Together, they will do the heavy lifting inside the turbine hall as work ramps up on installing the Arabelle steam turbine. Like the polar crane within the reactor building, this crane will also be important throughout Hinkley Point C's operation.

Celebrating Apprenticeship Week

Our apprenticeship schemes bring bright new talent to Hinkley Point C, running in conjunction with project partners, including Bylor, The MEH Alliance and EDF. More than 1,300 apprentices have already been trained.

Apprenticeships are available in over 80 different subjects and provide remarkable learning opportunities during the construction phase and for the next generation of the Hinkley Point C team. Apprentices contribute by working in vital roles while they train all whilst earning a good salary.

In February, we celebrated National Apprenticeship week, with MEH Director Simon Lafferty sharing his apprenticeship story. A number of online events were also run, giving people the chance to learn more about our apprenticeship schemes.
