All are welcome from the neighbouring villages.



All necessary repairs to the playground are now complete, all equipment is now in safe and fully operational condition. Whilst some wear and tear is to be expected, we have seen a concerning amount of damage due to vandalism. The Suspension Birds Nest swing will be replaced soon because the previous one unfortunately went missing.

I am really getting to know the children now and it is a pleasure to be part of this lovely community. Beacon Class

For two weeks we learned about climate change, what it is and why it is harming the planet. Naturalist David Attenborough is quoted saying that "right now, we are facing a manmade disaster of global scale. Our greatest threat in thousands of years. Climate change." Using this quote as well as our own knowledge and learning, we had a debate in class with the title of 'Who is responsible for the planet?' We listened to each other's points of argument with respect and added our own voices to the discussion.

Ask us what we think about who is responsible for the planet: we had many ideas such as world leaders, people, every living thing and us as a community. What do you think? Who should be responsible for the planet?

Triscombe

All the children have been working incredibly hard and we are so proud of their achievements.

Reception have had a busy and exciting time. A real highlight was their **autumn walk**, where they investigated and collected evidence of the changing season. Back in class, they used magnifying glasses to take a closer look at their treasures. They have also been enjoying the story of *The Gingerbread Man* and even had the opportunity to bake their own gingerbread – what a treat!

In **Key Stage 1**, the children have shown great effort and enthusiasm in all their learning. In English, they have been writing some fantastic letters.

In Maths, **Year 1** have been consolidating their knowledge of number sequences, while **Year 2** have been developing confidence with counting in tens and partitioning two-digit numbers to understand how many tens are in a whole number.

In **Geography**, the children have been learning about the differences between a village, a town, and a city – and they have truly wowed us with their knowledge!

Finally, a big well done to everyone for their brilliant progress in reading. It has been such a joy to hear the children reading with increasing fluency and confidence.



Preschool

This week in preschool we have been looking at how we feel and how to express ourselves; when feeling happy, sad or angry. The children have listened to the story 'The colour monster' and we then made our own colour monsters to express how we were feeling.

We used fine motor skills to cut fruit up and add to yoghurt and milk to make some healthy

smoothies for snack.
The children enjoyed turning on the blender and watching the mixture spin round, and the smoothies tasted delicious!

We also have lots of outdoor fun, making brick houses, drawing our families, and enjoying exploring the village on our walks.

With the civil construction work nearing completion and the second dome in place, attention is now firmly on the power station's fit out with pipes, cables and equipment.

MEH on the move

By the end of this year, civil construction for Unit 1 will be 95% complete. Unit 2 is following closely behind and is expected to reach the same milestone by the end of next year.

With the main structural work nearly finished, we're now moving into the next phase: installing mechanical, electrical, and heating systems. We're also making great progress on room handovers. By year-end, 2,500 rooms will be handed over, bringing us closer to our goal of delivering 7,000 rooms across the entire project.

Big Boost for Victoria Park Community Centre

Victoria Park Community Centre in Bridgwater has been awarded nearly £47,000 from the Hinkley Point C Community Fund to enhance its facilities and support key services like the youth club and Local Pantry. The grant will fund new equipment, staff costs, and help provide affordable food to families—benefiting over 1,000 weekly visitors and strengthening community connections across all ages.



Powering Ahead: First Electrical Cabinets Installed on Nuclear Island

We've reached another exciting milestone — our first electric switchgear cabinets are now installed on Nuclear Island, and ahead of schedule.

These cabinets will play a vital role in powering the safety and operational systems in the Safeguard Buildings.

Their installation marks a shift in focus from construction work to the next phase: installing mechanical, electrical, and ventilation systems (MEH). The first units are now in place in one of the Safeguard Buildings, setting the stage for the complex network of control systems and cabling needed to support future testing and commissioning.
