In addition, SCN volunteers collect **prescriptions** from the two local Health Centres and deliver these to the **SPAR/POST OFFICE** for collection. If your Surgery has designated you a housebound or home delivery patient, we will deliver to you at home. (Please Note: This is only for those patients who are unable to collect from the Surgery or the SPAR/PO.)

FOOD BANK / PANTRY ~ DONATIONS AND DELIVERIES

The SCN supports the work of the Quantock Food Bank and Mobile Pantry. We are always grateful for donations to the Foodbank collection box in the SPAR/ Post Office. If you, or someone you know, need food assistance please contact us or the Village Agent (for a Foodbank referral) and/or Home Start (for families with young children). STOGURSEY ALLOTMENT NEWS

Days are short and the weather is cold, but the allotment sits largely dormant, tucked in for the winter. Traditionalists might lean on the gate admiring their freshly-dug and fertilised patch, dark weed-free soil ready for planting in the new year. Elsewhere the work of converts to "no-dig" gardening is clear to see: fertile earth sits cosily under tarpaulin or cardboard, worms happily munching in the dark through compost and manure and wriggling all that goodness deep down into the soil. Those who have planned ahead might wander along to harvest parsnips or sprouts for Christmas Day, to accompany potatoes, squash and beans collected and stored earlier in the year. A jar or two of home-made zingy green tomato chutney (what a bonzer year it was for tomatoes!) or perhaps spiced marrow chutney goes down well with cheese and biscuits.

Meanwhile, thoughts turn to next year. Too soon, maybe, to start sowing, but out comes the box of seeds collected and carefully stored through the year: beans, tomatoes, pumpkin, cucumber... Plans start to form in the mind. Could I add some marigolds and nasturtium to attract the bees? How about onions next year? Roll on the New Year and new beginnings...



Allotments

We are pleased to report that nearly all allotments have now been allocated. If you are interested in obtaining a plot, please contact the Clerk. If none are currently available, we will add your name to the waiting list.

Speed indicator devices.

Two new speed indicator devices are on order and will be delivered soon:

One will replace the unit destroyed at Claylands Corner. The other unit will be installed further along Hinkley Road.

Defibrillator and CPR awareness training session Thank you to everyone who attended the Defibrillator and CPR awareness session in October. It was a great success, and we plan to hold more sessions in 2026.

Stogursey Remembers

The Parish Council hosted its annual **Remembrance Day ceremony** at the Gravel, which was very well attended by residents of all ages. A poppy wreath was laid to honour those who gave their lives in both World Wars and subsequent conflicts, so that we may live in peace.

We would also like to thank **Stogursey C of E Primary School** for providing a beautiful wreath made by the children—a thoughtful and appreciated gesture.

We will remember them.

Land at Paddons Farm

A recent site meeting was held with Strongvox to address the clearing of debris left by contractors, which has become an eyesore at the entrance to our village. Both parties agreed on actions to restore the area promptly.

We also thank two residents who helped facilitate the meeting and raised additional concerns, including:

Repairing streetlamps

Installing a rubbish bin in the infants' playground Providing a clear sign stating the playground is for infants only.

Unfortunately, older youths have been gathering there late at night, causing noise, and leaving litter. If you experience **anti-social behaviour (ASB)**, please call **101** at the time of the disturbance. Your name will not be shared with those involved.

Once cleared, one plot of land will become a muchneeded car park, the other plot will be an eco friendly relaxing area, planted with indigenous trees etc.



Outfall tunnel complete

A major milestone has been achieved with the completion of structural work on the outfall tunnel system, which will carry sea water away from Units 1 and 2 after it's been used to cool our power station. The final concrete pour into a 42-metre shaft near the seawall marks the successful connection of three key tunnels—two incoming and one leading to the Bristol Channel.

This follows the installation of the 250-tonne Triple Point Connection, a complex prefabricated structure linking the tunnels.

With reinforcement and formwork now complete, the shaft will soon be sealed and backfilled, marking the end of this phase.

Unit 1 Emergency Diesel Generators installed

We've reached another key milestone with the installation of the first two Emergency Diesel Generators in Unit 1's Diesel Building. These generators provide essential backup power in the event of a mains supply failure and are critical to supporting Cold Functional Testing later in the project.

Each Emergency Diesel Generators can deliver 9.3 MWe and operate for up to 72 hours without refuelling.

With the Emergency Diesel Generators now in place, work can progress on fitting out associated systems and infrastructure. This marks a significant step forward in delivering the site's robust safety systems.
