THE CHRISTMAS TREE FESTIVAL 2025

Once again, the Festival seems such a long time ago, as I write this in the wake of Storm Goretti to go in February's edition of Stogursey News. Judging by the lovely comments we received, both during and after the Festival, it proved to be as big a success as in the two previous years.

The 21 trees included 7 new entrants including craft and music groups, nature-based ones plus the 'Christmas Teddy Bear Tree' – a fundraiser for the Beacon Centre at Musgrove Park (Google it and you will find the write-up in the West Somerset Free Press following attendance at the opening by a reporter). As always, we were delighted by the variety, imagination and artistic flair that went into the making of the decorations which gave us such a wonderfully eclectic display of trees.

THE VICTORY HALL LOTTERY

LACEMAKING WORKSHOP

At last year's Arts Festival the Crafternoon Club held a demonstration of different crafts. I dug out my bobbins and lace pillow and demonstrated the traditional craft of bobbin lacemaking. I first learnt to make bobbin lace 40 years ago when I lived in Bedfordshire, a traditional hub of lacemaking, especially in the 19th century.

This is a craft that goes back to the 16th century and is thought to have developed in Italy from medieval braid weaving. It requires a pillow and many bobbins, which are used in pairs to create intricate designs.

At the Arts Festival some of the people who watched the demonstration showed an interest in learning this endangered traditional craft. In light of this I have booked the St Audries Room at the Victory Hall on **Sunday 1st February between 1pm and 3pm** to run a workshop in lacemaking which I hope will turn into a lacemaking class on a regular basis.

If you have your own equipment then bring it along. I have some homemade starter kits which I can sell for £8 to cover costs. A place on the workshop will cost £5, again to cover costs. If you are interested, please email me labond222@gmail.com.

STOGURSEY ALLOTMENT NEWS

It's been a fairly slow month at the allotments, what with
seasonal festivities and the biting cold inviting oneself to
stay indoors.

There's still plenty to do to keep warm if venturing out.
Digging the allotment has pretty much ended on our plot
as, inspired by the late, great Ron and his love of the "no
dig" method, we tend to feed the soil with as much
compost as we can get hold of and by making our own.
Spreading an inch or two of compost over the soil allows
the worms and soil microbes to get to work, taking in
nutrients, aerating the soil and doing the digging for you.

That's the theory anyway. Time will tell if it's successful
but it sure does help with the back pain!

Now is a good time to plant soft fruit, or prune established
plants to encourage a bountiful crop, and for many,
February is sowing time for tomatoes, peppers and
aubergines. These plants need a long growing season so
benefit from an early start. Once sown, be sure to keep
the seeds warm or they'll struggle to germinate.

At the time of writing, all plots are currently taken, but
there is still one large raised bed available if anyone
wants to try their hand. Or maybe put your name down on
the waiting list in case a plot becomes available. If
interested contact the Clerk to the Parish Council by

Here's to a successful, productive year ahead and the
hope that Cabbage Whites develop a taste for bindweed
and couch grass!

Notes from the Quantock Medical Centre

I would firstly like to wish everyone a happy and healthy New Year and thank you for all your Christmas cards, kind wishes and treats at Christmas which were greatly appreciated.

We will be joining the Thomas Poole Library on Thursday 29th January 10am – 12 noon to support anyone who is interested in using their NHS App or applying for their NHS App. If you would like to have access to the NHS App, do pop along to the Medical Centre and ask for an application form and bring along some ID - a driving licence, passport or utility bill - and we will help set this up for you.

Our Patient Group will be meeting at the Nether Stowey Library on Thursdays at 10am on:

You are very welcome to come along and join us, feel free to ask any questions about your local health services or what's happening in the area the more the merrier.

Thank you for your responses to our regular Friends and family test questions following your appointment at the practice. We do appreciate your feedback, and try and act on any suggestions where we can make improvements and where funding allows.

Over the last year we have updated several chairs in the waiting area and in the clinical rooms as requested. We have tried to improve the décor to be brighter and more modern and added music to help distract from being overheard on reception.

Unfortunately, one of the key themes which we find hard to accommodate is to open the dispensary window all day. We would struggle to do this due to the need to significantly increase our manpower in the dispensary, which would be a huge cost to the practice. Currently the window is closed for certain times of the day to allow for ordering and replacing stock, as well as making up peoples' requests for medication (we provide over 10,000 items every month). We need to avoid interruptions during these times to ensure mistakes are not made from a patient safety point of view. We are hopeful that, in time, with additional funding we will be able to support this request.

We often get conflicting requests such as: have more patient information available/ too much information is available. If there is anything you cannot find, do please ask at reception and we are happy to search for this for you.

We have launched a Facebook page for patient information and patient notices, and hope patients will find this helpful.

We have a few staff changes at the Practice: we will be sad to say goodbye to Ali in dispensary in February, and to Jacqui one of our Long-Term Condition Nurses in March. We hope to find good replacements to join the team as soon as possible to ensure we maintain our excellent patient care.

New members are very welcome and spare ukuleles always available. Perhaps Ukulele will be your new hobby for 2026.

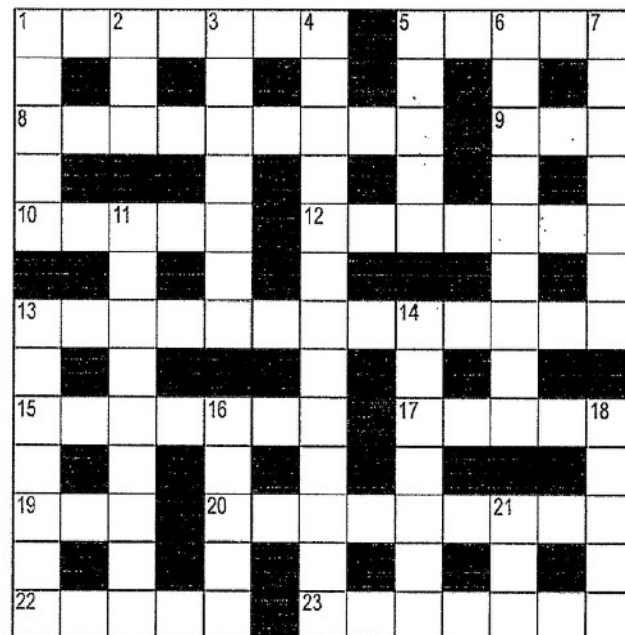

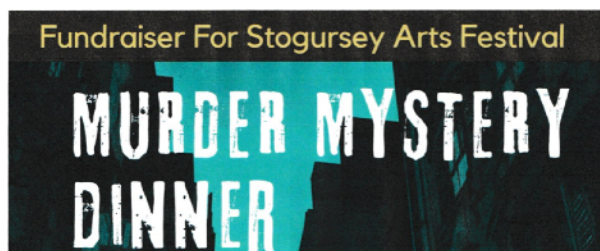

Pluggedin Parish News

A round up of the latest news from Hinkley Point C



2026 is set to be a pivotal and action-packed year for Hinkley Point C with progress and transformation across the construction site. Our top priority will be driving progress on Unit 1, with a strong focus on Mechanical, Electrical, and equipment installations. You'll see major milestones as more equipment is fitted into buildings whilst thousands of individual pipe sections will be installed. We will also be continuing to see progress on the second reactor with the installation of the Reactor Pressure Vessel later in the year.

Second Nuclear Reactor has arrived

The Reactor Pressure Vessel for Unit 2 arrived safely at the construction site last month.

The pressure vessel harnesses nuclear fission to make heat and steam for the world's largest turbines. Each one will power around 3 million homes around the clock. The high strength steel cylinder weighs in at 500-tonnes and is just 13-metres long.



The reactor was shipped from the Framatome Saint Marcel factory in France to Avonmouth Docks in Bristol, before being transported by barge to Combwich Wharf on the River Parrett in Somerset. The final journey was a six hour road trip for four miles by a transporter to the construction site.

Rotor delivery

We've received the first main-shaft component for the world's largest steam turbine. The high and intermediate pressure rotor arrived last week from Arabelle Solutions in Belfort, France, and is now in the Unit 1 Turbine Hall.

With 13 sets of precision blades, the rotor will use high-pressure steam from the Reactor Building to spin at 1,500 revolutions per minute, driving electricity generation in the Stator.

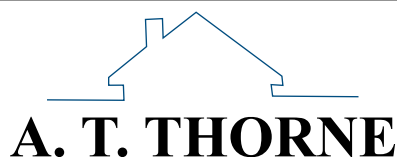

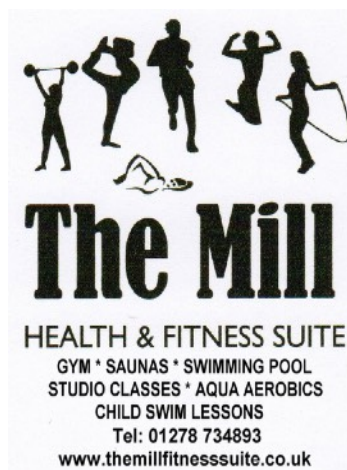
