STOGURSEY ALLOTMENT NEWS

Happy New Year!

I hope many of you managed to visit the wonderful Christmas tree festival in the Church last month. If you did, you may have noticed the Stogursey allotmentees' first attempt at a tree and our homage to the late Ron Balaam and his chickens – all of whom are sadly missed.

We've had our allotment in Stogursey for about 18 months now, luckily right behind our home. What does an allotment mean? Different things to everyone. For some it is the pleasure and satisfaction in growing and eating your own food, it tastes different, better than bought from the shop, you know what went into it, and the environment benefits from reducing the cost of what you eat.

For some it is the work itself - the exercise and fresh air, digging and turning the ground, watering, protecting from pests, the ache of used muscles and getting or maintaining fitness, the mindfulness of seeding, weeding, harvesting and storage. The pleasure of weighing stones of potatoes, onions, carrots and parsnips, knowing we did this and the financial saving which can be significant.

I have loved having meals this year where the only shop bought ingredient was the meat. In this time of financial pressures having extra food to supplement your income, to be able to gift to family and friends, the emotional boost and mental security that offers is very welcome.

The allotment is a continuous cycle of preparation, growth, harvest and maintenance. December was a time for maintenance, and January is completing your maintenance and preparing for the coming year. Depending on the weather, you could be digging over the empty patches aerating the soil, adding compost or well-rotted manure while digging over, or spreading over the surface for it to incorporate naturally. If the weather is bad, work indoors, finish maintenance of tools, clean pots and seed trays, and plan your planting for the year. Order seeds and begin chitting early potatoes. Buy shallots and onion sets ahead of planting in February and March.

The allotment is not just for one person, it's an investment for your family. If you have the time to put into it, I encourage you to register for a plot, and begin growing some of your own produce, spreading the work as a family. It's not instant but in our second year here we had 7 stone of potatoes, about the same of tomatoes, more peas and beans than we could eat, raspberries, strawberries, gooseberries, courgettes and lettuce and cucumber, carrots and parsnips, and in 2026 I hope for more again.

This month's news reflects the exciting things that were going on at school towards the end of the winter term, when all the staff and children were very busy with Christmas activities.

The Christmas tree is up in the hall; the children are practising carols so it's feeling very Christmassy around school.

I hope everyone enjoyed the nativity play as much as I did. So many stars in the making! It is always a special time to remember when the children are small.

Thank you for supporting the trip to the pantomime, the children had a fabulous time and behaved so well. I have heard all sorts of exciting stories today - excitement about the 'flying' carriage and a little indignation that the Dame called the children 'smelly children'!

On a positive note, we are going to apply for a grant from Hinkley to put with the FOSS money to totally revamp the playground. We have a very exciting plan, but the quote has come in at £47,000 meaning we need another £32,000 to be able to go ahead. The grant application needs letters of support that include why the Stogursey children need the play ground i.e. for after school clubs, holiday clubs etc. and how the power station work is negatively impacting the village, traffic, queues of traffic to get to other parks etc. and how the power station negatively impacts the children.



From the Quantock Hills to Gilgil, Kenya – my month volunteering with *Restart Africa*

At the beginning of the year, I learnt about *Restart Africa*, a charity that transforms the lives of vulnerable street children in Kenya. It was set up by Mary Coulson MBE, a Scot who went to Kenya to teach in schools. She soon realised that there were many children who were deprived, living alone and subject to abuse . . . so she decided to do something about it.

Mary set up *Restart* as a charity with a purpose to rescue street children and provide them with education, healthcare, food and a safe place to live. I was really moved by this and decided I wanted to help too.

During October, my ‘normal’ 9-5 was put on hold and I headed to Gilgil - 2 hours north of Nairobi - as a volunteer. I was nervous and excited to travel but grateful for the opportunity to spend my month helping others. I am so glad that I did as it was a life-changing and humbling experience for me.

During my time at *Restart* I helped with cleaning, sports, reading with the children, preparing meals and at the local schools. My downtime was used to learn more about the charity and explore the local area which included a safari where I saw the Big Five.

When I arrived at *Restart*, I quickly began to learn about the heartbreak backgrounds many of the children had been rescued from.

One of the first stories I heard was about Mark. He was a newborn baby when he was dumped in a drainage ditch at the side of the road. Whoever left him there likely hoped he would drown as the ditches flood during rain. Thankfully, he was found and taken to a local hospital, but heartbreakingly, the hospital then sold him to a disabled woman who could not have children of her own.

When Mark was around 18 months old, the woman moved to Gilgil and began to abuse him. She made him sleep in a goat shed behind her shack and would beat him regularly, even fracturing his skull on one occasion. Mark was starved and forced into long working hours. Believing she might one day kill him, Mark escaped one night and made his way to the Gilgil police station, where he bravely told them what had been happening. He stayed at the station for two weeks before *Restart* was able to take him in. Today, he is safe, healthy, and enjoying his education.

Mark’s story is just one of hundreds. Each child who arrives at *Restart* has lived through trauma that’s almost impossible to imagine, yet their transformation is extraordinary. Within just a few weeks of being at *Restart*, I saw children who once carried immense pain

begin to smile and laugh which is a reflection of the care and compassion they receive.

One moment that has stayed with me was when I treated the children to what, in their eyes, was a special supper — beef and chapati instead of their regular ugali (cornmeal porridge) that they eat twice a day . It cost just £20 to feed 90 children (22p each!) a special meal and that was the best £20 I’ve spent in ages as the excitement and joy it brought to them was infectious. It was a simple reminder of how much happiness can come from even the smallest act of kindness. The things we so easily take for granted here in the UK.

This whole experience has made me realise how easy it is to overlook the basic things — safety, warmth, love — that every child deserves but so many have to fight for. Watching the team at *Restart* pour endless love and patience into every child has been a blessing to see and I am so pleased that I could be part of the children’s lives for a month.

Now I am back in the UK, I want to continue to help the charity and ask that you consider this too.

As a not-for-profit organisation, *Restart* relies entirely on donations and sponsorship to continue its work, with every contribution helping to ensure that more children in Kenya are given the chance to grow up in safety, receive an education, and dream of a brighter future.

There are many ways to help, from a one-time gift or a monthly donation, to sponsoring a child or donating essential items like clothes, stationery, or supplies. *Restart* also welcomes volunteers like me, so if you or someone you know wants to experience this life-changing work firsthand, get involved. If you don’t want to physically go to Kenya, you could consider becoming a Trustee to help this charity grow and help more children realise their potential.

If you have any **unwanted clothes** that are still in **good condition** and suitable for **children aged 2–18 years**, *Restart* are continuously collecting items and would be so grateful for your support.

New Video: Hinkley Point C in 2025


Hinkley Point C has released its End of Year film, showcasing the night shift that keeps Britain's largest infrastructure project moving 24/7.

14,000 people are working around the clock to deliver Britain's first nuclear power station in more than 30 years.

In July, the world's largest crane, Big Carl lifted the 245-tonne domed roof onto the second reactor building.

As most buildings near completion, teams are now focused on fitting thousands of pipes, cables, and critical systems to bring the station to life.

Pressuriser installed

The 14.8 metre high Pressuriser was successfully installed into the Unit 1 Reactor Building (HR).

This component is the final large piece of the Primary Circuit to be installed, following the completion of the four Steam Generators last month.

The Pressuriser will play a crucial part in the Reactor Coolant System by maintaining pressure within the Primary Circuit of 155 bar, critical for safe operation
